Then a Serjeant and Twelve Grenadiers of the Foot Guards.

Then Eleven Serjeants of the Foot Guards, carrying the Eleven French Colours, advanced. Then the Four Companies of Grenadiers of

the Foot Guards closed the March.

In this Manner they proceeded from Ken-fington, through Hyde Park, the Green Park, into St. James's Park, and through the Stable Yard St. James's, into Pall Mall, and fo on to the West Gate of St. Paul's, where the Colours were received by the Dean and Chapter, attended by the Choir ; about which Time the Guns at the Tower, and in St. James's Park, were fired.

The faid Colours are to be put up in fome publick Part of the faid Cathedral Church, as a lafting Memorial of the Success of His Majefty's Arms, in the Reduction of the important Fortrels of Louisbourg, and the Islands of Cape Breton and St. John.

Piftols and Hatchets, on Board the faid Dutch Ship, and after examining the Papers, they by Violence forced open the Hatchways, and went into the faid ship's Hold, and there broke open awo Trunks belonging to the faid Marquis de Pignateilij, wherein were rich Cloths, and laced Liveries, which they took and carried away, to their own Ship : And that about Two o'Clock in the Afternoon of the fame Day, the Commander, who was a young Man, and wore a Gold laced Hat, together with lome of the Crew of another of the faid English Vessels, (being a Cutter, or fingle Maft Sloop, mounted with rear Guns) came armed as aforetaid, on Board the faid Dutch Ship, and after examining the Ship's Papers, and those of the Passengers, pretended the fame were Falfe and Counterfeit, and then went into the faid Ship's Hold, and began to plunder the Effects there ; and that whilf they were fo doing, the Crew of the aforefaid English Veffel which boarded the faid Dutch Ship about Nine o'Clock that Morning, returned again, and joined those who were then in the faid Ship's Hold, and that then both the faid Crews in Conjunction, committed very great Outrages, by breaking open all the faid Marquis de Pignatellij's Cafes, and Frunks, and taking and carrying away all the valuable Effects, which were in fix of the faid Cafes and Trunks, and defiroying or damaging the Reft of choie Effects; and then falling upon his the faid Minister's Officers, and beating them in a very cruel and shameful Manner, and stripping them of their Cloths, and carrying the same off, together with their Letters of Credit, and a Bill of Exchange.
