The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council, of the Twenty Eighth of July last, For paying the respective Bounties therein mentioned, to all Able and Or-dinary Seamen, and also to all Able-bodied Landmen, who should voluntarily enter themfelves in His Majesty's Royal Navy; and likewife for paying the Rewards to Perfons difcovering Seamen who fhould conceal themfelves, will expire upon the Thirtieth Day of this Instant September ; And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, That the Bounties and Rewards, thereby given, fhould be continued to be paid for fome Time longer; - His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby Order, That the Bounties of Three Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years; and of Thirty Shillings for every Able-bodied Land-man, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, be continued to be paid to fuch Seamen and Landmen refpectively, who shall, on or before the Eighteenth Day of November next, enter themselves in the Royal Navy, in the Manner directed by His Majefty's Proclamation of the Fourth Day of January 1757: And likewife, That the Rewards of Two Pounds for every Able, and Twenty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, be conkinued to be paid to any Perfons who shall, on or before the faid Eighteenth Day of November next, discover any Seaman or Seamen who shall conceal themfelves, fo as fuch Seaman or Seamen be taken for His Majesty's Service. Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.

The humble Address of the Mayor and Burgeffes of the Town of Nottingham.

WE your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Mayor and Burgeffes of the Town of Nottingham, in Common Council allembled, most humbly beg Leave to congratulate your Majesty on the fignal Success with which it hath pleafed the Almighty to favour your Arms and Councils.

We reflect, with inexpressible Satisfaction, on the Joy which must fill your Royal Breast, while you behold the gloomy Apprehenfions of your Subjects fo foon diffipated ; your Domi-nions in Germany freed from the Ravages of an infolent Enemy; the Laurels gained by your Forces under Prince Ferdinand of Brunfwick ; and your Great Ally and Relation triumphing over the boafted and favage Strength of Ruffia ; a Foundation laid for extending the Commerce of your Subjects both in Africa and America ; and an ineffimable Jewel added to your Crown by the taking of Cape Breton.

The Zeal and fleady Refolution with which your Majesty's Orders have been executed at Saint Malo and Cherburg, by the Succeffor of our late most worthy Representative, afford us great Confolation, while we are lamenting the Lofs of a Life to valuable and fo univerfally regretted.
