WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council, of the Fifteenth of September laft, For paying the respective Bounties therein mentioned, to all Able and Ordinary Seamen, and also to all Able-bodied Landmen, who should voluntarily enter themfelves in His Majesty's Royal Navy; and likewife for paying the Rewards to Perfons difco-vering Seamen who should conceal themselves, will expire upon the Eighteenth Day of this Inftan. November ; And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, That the Bounties and Rewards thereby given, fhould be continued to be paid for fome Time longer; — His Majefty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby Order, That the Bounties of Three Pounds for every Abl-Seaman, and of Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years; and of Thirty Shillings for every Able-bodied Land-man, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, be continued to be paid to fuch Seamen and Landmen refpectively, who shall, on or before the Thirtieth Day of December next, enter themfelves in the Royal Navy, in the Manner directed by His Majefty's Proclamation of the Fourth Day of January 1757: And likewife, That the Rewards of Two Pounds for every Able, and Twenty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, be continued to be paid to any Perfons who shall, on or before the faid Thirtieth Day of December next, difcover any Seaman or Seamen who fhall conceal themselves, so as such Seaman or Seamen be taken for His Majesty's Service.
