**AT** the Court at *Kensington*, the 7th Day of *November*, 1758,

P R E S E N T,

The **KING's** most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council, of the Fifteenth of September last, For paying the respective Bounties therein mentioned, to all Able and Ordinary Seamen, and also to all Able-bodied Landmen, who should voluntarily enter themselves in His Majesty's Royal Navy; and likewise for paying the Rewards to Persons discovering Seamen who should conceal themselves, will expire upon the Eighteenth Day of this Instant November; And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, That the Bounties and Rewards thereby given, should be continued to be paid for some Time longer; — His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby Order, That the Bounties of Three Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years; and of Thirty Shillings for every Able-bodied Landman, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, be continued to be paid to such Seamen and Landmen respectively, who shall, on or before the Thirtieth Day of December next, enter themselves in the Royal Navy, in the Manner directed by His Majesty's Proclamation of the Fourth Day of January 1757: And likewise, That the Rewards of Two Pounds for every Able, and Twenty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, be continued to be paid to any Persons who shall, on or before the said Thirtieth Day of December next, discover any Seaman or Seamen who shall conceal themselves, so as such Seaman or Seamen be taken for His Majesty's Service. Whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themselves accordingly.

*Most Gracious Sovereign,*

**W**E your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Mayor, Recorder, Aldermen and Burgesses of your Borough of Kirkby in Kendal, in Court assembled, beg Leave, with

the utmost Humility, to congratulate your Majesty on the signal Success in America, which the Divine Providence hath lately indulged to the Wisdom of your Councils, the Courage of your Army, and the Resolution of your Fleet.

Devoutly thankful to the Almighty God, and deeply grateful to the best of Kings, we unfeignedly rejoice in the great and valuable Conquest of the Fortrefs of Louisbourg and the Islands of Cape Breton and Saint John, a Conquest that covers your Majesty's Name with Glory, fills the Hearts of your Subjects with Gladness, and opens a liberal Source of Wealth to the Trade and Commerce of your Dominions. May this important Acquisition ever continue a Part of the British Empire, as a powerful Check to the all-grasping Ambition of an Enemy, who tramples on the Faith of Treaties, and violates the Rights of Nations, who has an insatiate Thirst to oppress the Liberties, and engross the Properties of all Europe.

But we can take no ill Omens or painful Apprehensions from the Insolence of this grand Troubler of Mankind. We are strongly guarded by the Exertion and the Efficacy of your Majesty's civil and military Perfections. Your Paternal Care, and steady Magnanimity, maintain and confirm to us the national Blessings, which are dear and desirable to a free and faithful People. We are truly sensible, most Gracious Sovereign, your Generous Publick Spirit, and Patriot Administration, every Day display to your Britons, that you have their Good affectionately and constantly at Heart; that you Place your only Interest in their Safety; your chief Glory in their Welfare; and ever think yourself most happy, when you can most increase their Happiness.—What can be more excellent in a King, or more beneficent to Subjects, than this your Royal Goodness, and Greatness of Mind?

For these Reasons, it is, and ever shall be, our fervent and daily Prayer to the All-powerful Being, to protect your Sacred Person, and make your Reign long, very long, glorious and happy; free from the Disturbances of foreign Ambition, domestick Treason, and clamorous Faction.

May the Almighty God vouchsafe to defend your Fleets and Armies; may He inspire your Admirals and Generals with clear Wisdom, firm Courage, and sincere Unanimity; and constantly animate them, and all under their Command, to outdo the Enemy as much in the Bravery of their Actions, as in the Justice of their Cause. May he finally grant them such complete Victories as will perpetuate the Glory of your Majesty's Reign, and the Happiness of your faithful Britons.

In Testimony of our Duty, Loyalty, and Affection, we have hereunto affixed our Common Seal, this Eighth Day of November 1758.

*Constantinople,*

*Constantinople, Oct. 2.* There have been severe Prohibitions against Drefs renewed here again lately by the Sultan's exprefs Order; and the late Examples of Severity are so recent in the Minds of the People, that most conform to the Rules prescribed. The Vizir, by his prudent Administration, continues in full Power. The Grand Seignor, who seemed to be of a weak Constitution on his Accession to the Throne, is now extremely active, and takes much Exercise. Aly Pascha Echim Ogli, who was honoured three Times with the high Post of Vizir, died lately at his Paschalyck of Cutaya. His Body was embalmed, and brought hither to be interred in his own Mosque near the Seven Towers. He is succeeded in his Paschalyck by Muzur Aga, Brother-in-Law to the Grand Seignor.

*Petersburgh, Oct. 10.* The Russian Fleet was come to the Height of Revel on the 3d Instant; and the Squadron of Cronstadt was expected there every Day, if they have escaped the late violent Storm, which drove two English Ships ashore near the Mouth of the River. Yesterday two new Eighty Gun Ships were launched at the Admiralty Wharf in this City.

*Dresden, Oct. 29.* His Prussian Majesty having had Notice, before he left Budissin, of the Detachments sent from the Duke de Deux Pont's Army to intercept the Convoy of Prisoners, &c. has, it is supposed, ordered that Convoy, instead of coming to Dresden, to march directly to Francfort on the Oder. This Conjecture is the more probable, as it now appears that these Detachments from Deux Pont's Army have not marched on, but occupy Bischoffswerda, Stolpen, and Radberg. By our Advices of the 25th Instant, the Prussians were encamped near Gorlitz, and Marshal Daun occupied the Heights of Landes-Crone, within half a Mile of the Prussian Camp. The Prussian Troops, under the Command of Lieutenant General Itzenplitz, remain in their Camp near Dohna.

*Dresden, Nov. 1.* By the last Accounts received from his Prussian Majesty's Army, it appeared that there had been a Skirmish between the Prussians and a Body of Austrian Cavalry, on the 26th past, near Gorlitz, to the Advantage of the former, who began the Attack, broke the Austrians, and drove them to a Hill near Landes-Crone. The Number of Prisoners taken from the latter, in this Affair, is said to be about 600 Men, besides Officers.

*Hague, Nov. 10.* There does not appear to be much Probability of any farther Operations, this Campaign, between the Armies in Westphalia. Prince Ferdinand's Head Quarters are at Munster, and the French seem to be filing off to their Winter Quarters.
