## PRESENT,

The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WITHEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council, of the Fifteenth of September laft, For paying the refpective Bounties therein mentioned, to all Able and Ordinary Seamen, and also to all Able-bodied Landmen, who fhould voluntarily enter themfelves in His Majesty's Royal Nawy ; and likewife for paying the Rewards to Persons difcovering Seamen who thould conceal themfelves, will expire upon the Eighteenth Day of this Inftant November ; And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, That the Bounties and Rewards thereby given, fhould be continued to be paid for fome Time longer; - His Majefty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby Order, That the Bounties of Three Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years; and cf Thirty Shillings for every Able-bodied Landman, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, be continued to be paid to fuch Seamen and Landmen refpectively, who shall, on or before the Thirtieth Day of December next, enter themfelves in the Royal Navy, in the Manner directed by His Majefty's Proclamation of the Fourth Day of January 1757: And likewife, That the Rewards of Two Pounds for every Able, and Twenty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, be continued to be paid to any Perfons who shall, on or before the faid Thirtieth Day of December next, discover any Seaman or Seamen who shall conceal themfelves, fo as fuch Seaman or Seamen be taken for His Majefty's Service. Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.

The Duc de Deux Ponts has recalled the Detachments he had fent over the Elbe, and is moved to Freyberg, which has obliged General Itzenplitz, who commands in the Abfence of Prince Henry, to change his Position: He is now encamped near Kefielfdorff.

It is confidently faid, that the Ruffians have raifed the Siege of Colberg, after befieging it near a Month: The Detachment that formed the Siege thereof, is retired toward. Marienwerder, and the Army under General Fermor towards Poland.

The Army under Marshal Contades is filing off continually to its Winter Quarters.

Prince Ferdinand's Head Quarters are ftill at Munfter, but nothing has happened in those Parts. Prince Ysenbourg is at Gottingen and the Neighbourhood.

Hague, Nov. 17. The Siege of Neifs has been railed; the News of his Pruffian Majefty's marching that Way, having been fufficient to determine General Harfh to aband in it, which he did in the Night between the 5th and 6th Inftant; and the Garrifon gained a confiderable Advantage over the Befiegers, in a Sally they made upon that Occafion. The King of Pruffia, who ftopt upon this News at Gros-Noffen, between Breflau and Neifs, immediately returned to Lufatia, to oppofe the Army under the Command of Marfhal Daun, which, it is reported; had marched back towards Drefden, in order to take Advantage of the King of Pruffia's Abfence from thofe Parts.

Marshal Contades has abandoned Hamm and the Lippe; and the Army under his Orders is hastening into Winter Quarters. Prince Ferdinand has likewise ordered the Army under his Command into Cantonments.
