## Admiralty Office, December 4, 1758.

MY Lords Committioners of the Admiralty having received many repeated Complaints of divers outragious Acts of Piracy committed on Board great Numbers of Ships, as well English as Neutral, failing in the English Channel, by the Crews of Ships or Veffels being or pretending to be English Privateers :

Their Lordships therefore, in order to detect and bring to Jultice the Perfons guilty of fuch Firacies and Robberies; (in Violation of the Laws of Na tions in general, and of this Kingdom in particular, and to the great Diffonour thereof) are pleafed to promife a Reward of FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, unto or amongst fuch Person or Persons as shall, within Three Months from this Time, discover any one or more of the Offenders guilty of any fuch Acts of Piracy as aforetaid, fo as fuch Offender or Offenders shall be apprehended and duly convicted thereof.

And in regard the Committing of fuch Offences as aforefaid are greatly encouraged by divers Per fons as Acceflaries thereto, who knowingly affift, maintain, councel, or advife the Committing of fuch Acts of Piracy, and also by Perlons who receive Goods fo piratically taken, and entertain and conceal Offenders, knowing them to have committed fuch Robberies

Their Lordships therefore, in order to detect or bring to Justice the Perlons guilty of fuch last men-tioned Offences, are pleased to promise a Reward of FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, unto or amongit fuch Perfon or Perfons as shall, within Three Months from this Time, difcover any one or more of the Offenders guilty of any fuch Offences last mentioned, fo as fuch Offender or Offenders shall be apprehended and duly convicted thereof. Which faid refpective Rewards before me ioned withall be paid, clear of all Deductions what/gever, by Samuel Seddon, Elq: Solicitor of the Admiralty, immediately after the Conviction of luch Offenders.

And as a further Encouragement, any of the faid Offenders, (other than and except the respective, Commander or Commanders of any fuch Piratical Ships or Veffels) who fhell difcover any one or more of the faid Ciffenders, fi.all, on the Conviction of fuch Offender or Offenders fo discovered, be intitled to His Maiefty's most Gracious Pardon. And their Lordships do also promise to grant,

upon Request, to every Person, being a Seaman, (who by making any fuch Difcovery or Difcoveries as aforefaid, fhall be intitled to either to the Whole, or to any Part or Parts of any of the above-mentioned Rewards) an absolute Protection, to prevent his being impressed into His Majesty's Sea Service, during this prefent War with France.

Browne and Smith, of Auftin Fryars, London.
