A^T the Court at Kenfington, the 7th Day jefty's Park the Phœnix, and answered by Volof November, 1758, lies from the Regiments in Garrison, which

PRESENT,

The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council, of the Fifteenth of September laft, For paying the respective Bounties therein mentioned, to all Able and Ordinary Seamen, and also to all Able-bodied Landmen, who should voluntarily enter themfelves in His Majefty's Royal Navy; and likewife for paying the Rewards to Perfons difcovering Seamen who fhould conceal themfelves, will expire upon the Eighteenth Day of this Instant November; And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, That the Bounties and Rewards thereby given, fhould be continued to be paid for fome Time longer; - His Majefty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby Order, That the Bounties of Three Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years; and of Thirty Shillings for every Able-bodied Landman, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, be continued to be paid to fuch Seamen and Landmen respectively, who shall, on or before the Thirtieth Day of December next, enter themselves in the Royal Navy, in the Manner directed by His Majefty's Proclamation of the Fourth Day of January 1757 : And likewile, That the Rewards of Two Pounds for every Able, and Twenty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, be continued to be paid to any Perfons who shall, on or before the faid Thirtieth Day of December next, discover any Seaman or Seamen who shall conceal themfelves, fo as fuch Seaman or Seamen be taken for His Majesty's Service. Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and governsthemfelves accordingly.

jefty's Park the Phœnix, and anfwered by Vollies from the Regiments in Garrifon, which were drawn out in the Royal Square at the Barracks. At Noon there was a fplendid Appearance of the Nobility, and other Perfons of Diffinction, to compliment the Lords Juffices upon this Occafion. In the Evening there was a Play given by their Excellencies for the Entertainment of the Ladies, and the Night concluded with Bonfires, Illuminations, and all other Demonftrations of Joy.

MY Lords Committioners of the Admiralty having received many repeated Complaints of divers outragious Acts of Piracy committed on Board great Numbers of Ships, as well English as Neutral, failing in the English Channel, by the Crews of Ships or Vessels being or pretending to be English Privateers :

Their Lordfhips therefore, in order to detect and bring to Juftice the Perfons guilty of fuch Piracies and Robberies, (in Violation of the Laws of Nations in general, and of this Kingdom in particular, and to the great Difhonour thereof) are pleafed to promife a Reward of FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, unto or amongft fuch Perfon or Perfons as fhall, within Three Months from this Time, difcover any one or more of the Offenders guilty of any fuch Acts of Piracy as aforefaid, fo as fuch Offender or Offenders fhall be apprehended and duly convicted thereof.

And in regard the Committing of fuch Offences as aforefaid are greatly encouraged by divers Perfons as Acceffaries thereto, who knowingly affift, maintain, councel, or advife the Committing of fuch Acts of Piracy, and also by Perfons who receive Goods fo piratically taken, and entertain and conceal Offenders, knowing them to have committed fuch Robberies :

Their Lordships therefore, in order to detect or bring to Justice the Perfons guilty of fuch last mentioned Offences, are pleafed to promife a Reward of FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, unto or amongst fuch Perfon or Perfons as shall, within Three Months from this Time, difcover any one or more of the Offenders guilty of any fuch Offences last mentioned, fo as fuch Offender or Offenders shall be apprehended and duly convicted thereof. Which faid respective Rewards before mentioned, shall be paid, clear of all Deductions whatfoever, by Samuel Seddon, Efq; Solicitor of the Admiralty, immediately after the Conviction of fuch Offenders.

And as a further Encouragement, any of the faid Offenders, (other than and except the respective Commander or Commanders of any such Piratical Ships
