HIS Day, the Lords being met, a Message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by Mr. Quarme, Deputy Gentleman-Ufher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that The Lords; authorized by Virtue of His Majefly's Commiffion, for declaring His Royal Alfent to feveral Acts agreed upon by both Houfes, do defire the immediate Attendance of this Honourable Houfe in the Houfe of Peers, to hear the Commiffion read ; and the Commons being come thither, the faid Commission, impowering his Royal Highness the Duke of Cumberland, the Lord Archbishop of Ganterbury, the Lord Keeper of the Great Seal, the Lord Prefident of the Council, and feveral other Lords, to declare and notify the Royal Affent to the faid Bills was read accordingly, and the Royal Affent given to,

An All for granting an Aid to His Majefly by. a Land Tax, to be raifed in Great Britain, for the Service of the Year One Thousand Seven Hundred and Fifty Nine.

An All for continuing and granting to His Majesty certain Duties upon Malt, Mum, Cyder, and Perry, for the Service of the Year One Thoufand Seven Hundred and Fifty Nine.

An Alt to continue for a limited Time, an Alt made in the last Seffion of Parliament, intitled, An Alt to permit the Importation of Salted Beef, Pork, and Butter, from Ireland, for a limited Time, and to amend the faid Act.

An Act to continue for a farther Time, the Prohibition of the, Exportation of Corn, Malt, Meal, Flour, Bread, Bifcuit, and Starch; and alfo to continue for a farther Time, the Prohibition of the making of Low Wines and Spirits from Wheat, Barley, Malt, or any other Sort of Grain, or from Meal, or Flour; and to prohibit for a limited Time, the making of Low Wines and Spirits from Bran.

THEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council, of the Fifteenth of September last, For paying the respective Bounties therein mentioned, to all Able and Ordinary Seamen, and also to all Able-bodied Landmen, who fhould voluntarily enter themfelves in His Majefty's Royal Navy; and likewife for paying the Rewards to Perfons difcovering Seamen who thould conceal themfelves, will expire upon the Eighteenth Day of this Inftant November; And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, That the Bounties and Rewards thereby given, should be continued to be paid for fome Time longer; - His Majefty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby Order, That the Bounties of Three Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years; and of Thirty Shillings for every Able-bodied Landman, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years; be continued to be paid to fuch Seamen and Landmen refuectively, who shall, on or before the Thirtieth Day of December next, enter themfelves in the Royal Navy, in the Manner directed by His Majefty's Proclamation of the Fourth Day of January 1757 : And likewife, That the Rewards of Two Pounds for every Able, and Twenty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, be continued to be paid to any Perfons who shall, on or before the faid Thirtieth Day of December next, discover any Seaman or Seamen who shall conceal themfelves, fo as fuch Seaman or Seamen be taken for His Majesty's Service. Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.
