Florence, Dec. 9. On the Ift Infant, by the violent Rains that we had for fome Days paft, the Arno fwelled fo much, that it overflowed the lower Part of the Town, by which feveral Houfes received confiderable Damage, and great Quantities of Provisions were destroyed; but the Damage has been still greater in the Country, where whole Diffricts have been laid under Water. The Emperor, as an Encouragement to People to fettle in the Suburbs of Leghorn, has caufed an Edict to be published, by which many Privileges and Exemptions are granted to those who should fix there.

Berlin, Dec. 16. This Day arrived here Andrew Mitchell, Efq; His Britannick Ma-jesty's Minister to this Court, on his Way to Breflaw, for which Place he will fet out in a Day or two, in order to attend the King our Sovereign, who' is supposed to have come to that City Yesterday.

Hambourg, Dec. 22. - Count Dohna artived at Mirou, a Town in the Dutchy of Mecklembourg Strelitz, on the 17th Inftant, with a very confiderable Body of Men. He is to join General Manteuffel's Corps, and pursue further Operations against the Swedes, who are re-treating in Haste towards Stralsund. The greatest Part of the Russian Army is retired back as far as Royal Pruffia ; the reft will winter in the Environs of Thorn, Marienwerder, and the Banks of the Viftula.

Whitehall, December 30, 1758. Whereas it has been humbly reprefented to the King, that, on the 16th Inflant, between Seven and Eight that, on the 10th inflant, between Seven and Light in the Evening, one John Moor, Brazier, of Gilling in Yorkshire, on his Return Home from Richmond Market, was found scad on the Turnpike Road bet ween Gilling and Richmond, about balf a Mile from the latter, wounded in his Breast and Groin by a Gun or Pistol, befiles Marks of Violence on his Head; and the' great Diligence bas been used to diferver the Author or Authors of this inhuman Murder, it has been, as yet, ineffectual: His Majefty, in order to difcover and bring to Jufice the Person or Persons who committed the jaid Murder, is hereby pleased to promise his most gracicus Pardon to any one of the Persons concerned therein, (except the Person who actually committed the faid Murder) who shall difcover bis, ber, or their Accomplice or Accomplices therein, fo that he, the, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

And as a further Encouragement, the Corporation of Rickmond, and the Widow of the faid John Moor, do promife a Reward of Fifty Pounds to be paid to fuch Perfon as shall give Information thereof, fo as that the Perfon or Perfons concerned in the faid Murder may be opprebended and convicted thereof.

failing in the English Channel, by the Crews of Ships or Veffels being or pretending to be English Privateers :

Their Lordships therefore, in order to detect and bring to Justice the Perfons guilty of fach Piracies and Robberies, (in Violation of the Laws of Na-tions in general, and of this Kingdom in particular, and to the great Dishonour thereof) are pleased to promise a Reward of FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, unto or amongst fuch Person or Persons as shall, within Three Months from this Time, difcover any one or more of the Offenders guilty of any fuch. Acts of Piracy as aforefaid, fo as fuch Offender or Offenders shall be apprehended and duly convicted thereof.

And in regard the Committing of fuch Offences as aforefaid are greatly encouraged by divers Per-fons as Accellaries thereto, who knowingly affift, maintain, councel, or advife the Committing of fuch Acts of Piracy, and allo by Perfons who receive Goods fo piratically taken, and entertain and conceal Offenders, knowing them to have committed fuch Robberies

Their Lordships therefore, in order to detect or bring to Justice the Persons guilty of such last mentioned Offences, are pleafed to promife a Reward of FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, unto or amongit fuch Perfon or Perfons as shall, within Three. Months from this Time, difcover any one or more of the Offenders guilty of any fuch Offences last mentioned, so as such Offender or Offenders shall be apprehended and duly convicted thereof. Which faid respective Rewards before mentioned, shall be paid, clear of all Deductions whatloever, by Samuel Seddon, Efq; Solicitor of the Admiralry, immediately after the Conviction of fuch Offenders,

And as a further Encouragement, any of the faid Offenders, (other than and except the respective Commander or Commanders of any fuch Piratical Ships or Veffels) who shall discover any one or more of the faid Offenders, shall, on the Conviction of fuch Offender or Offenders fo discovered, be intitled to His Majefty's most Gracious Pardon.

And their Lordfhips do alfo promife to grant, upon Requeft to every Perfon, being a Seaman, who by making any fuch Difcovery or Difcoveries as aforefaid, shall be intitled to either to the Whole, or to any Part or Parts of any of the above-mentioned Rewards) an absolute Protection, to prevent, his being impreffed into His Majesty's Sea Service, during this prefent War with France.
