as aforefaid, shall be intitled to either to the Whole, I the Conviction of the Offender or Offenders fo diffe or to any Part or Parts of any of the above-mentioned Rewards) an absolute Protection, to prevent his being impreffed into His Majesty's Sea Service, during this prefent War with France.

Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, IVI having received authentick Information, that a Galliot or Veffel, called the Juffrow Christina Elizabeth of Lubeck, whereof Casper Muntzenberger was Master, laden with different Kinds of Goods and Merchandize, belonging to the Subjects of the Empress of Ruffia, and bound from Rouen to St. Petersbourg, was, in the Course of her faid Voyage, on the 18th Day of September last, boarded three feveral Times by the Crews, or Part of the Crews, of fix English Ships or Veffels, being, or pretending to be Pri-vateers; and that at the first of those Times, viz. about One a-Clock in the Afternoon of that Day, fome of the Crews of the faid English Ships boarded the faid Galliot off Dungeness, and opening the Fore Hatchway, went into the Hold, and broke open a great many Cafes, and Packs of Merchan-dize, and unlawfully took, and carried away, great Quantities of Velvets, Silks, Silk-Stockings, Gloves, Confectionary Goods, and one whole Bale of Silk : And that between Three and Four a Clock in the fame Afternoon, being off Dover, the faid Galliot was again boarded by the Crews, or Part of the Crews, of three other English Ships, who being in Company, went together into the Hold, and rummaged the faid Galliot, and unlawfully took, and carried away, fome Silk, and Silk-Stockings, Part of which they wrapped about their Bodies, and put the reft into their Pockets, and alfo took away a Sword : And that foon afterwards, on the fame Day, the faid Galliot was a third Time boarded by the Crew, or Part of the Crew of another English Ship, who went into the Hold, broke open feveral Cafes, and unlawfully took, and carried away, two Boarloads of Merchandize, confifting of Men and Wo-men's Velvets, Silk, embroidered Cloaths, Silk-Stockings, Leather Gloves, French-Plate Candle-Iticks, fome Swords, and Hangers, Bottles of Cordials, Perfumes, and Confectionary and other Goods ; and then beat feveral of the faid Galliot's Crew, and confined the faid Mafter in his Cabbin, placing a Centry over him with Piftols :

Their Lordships therefore, in order to discover and bring to Juffice, the Perfons guilty of the Piratical Offences above-mentioned, are pleafed to pro-mife a Reward of FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, without any Deduction, unto or amongst fuch Per-fon or Perfons, as shall, within three Months from this Time, discover any one or more of the Offenders concerned in Committing all or any of the Piracies above-mentioned, fo as fuch Offender or Offenders shall be apprehended and duly convicted thereof : Which Reward shall be paid by Samuel Seddon, Efq; Solicitor of the Admiralty, immediately after the Conviction of fuch Offender or Offenders

And as a further Encouragement, any of the faid Offenders, (other than and except the respective Commander or Commanders of any of the abovementioned English Ships or Vessels) who shall discover any one or more, other of the faid Offenders, shall, on

covered, be likewise entitled to His Majesty's most gracious Pardon.
