PRESENT,

The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council, of the Seventh of November laft, For paying the respective Bounties therein mentioned, to all Able and Ordinary Seamen, and also to all Able-bodied Landmen, who should voluntarily enter them-selves in His Majesty's Royal Navy; and likewife for paying the Rewards to Perfons difcovering Seamen who should conceal themselves, will expire upon the Thirtieth Day of this Instant December ; And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, That the Bounties and Rewards thereby given, fhould be continued to be paid for fome Time longer; — His Majefty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby Order, That the Bounties of Three Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years; and of Thirty Shillings for every Able-bodied Land-man, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, be continued to be paid to fuch Seamen and Landmen refpectively, who shall, on or before the Twenty Eighth Day of February next, enter themselves in the Royal Navy, in the Manner directed by His Majefty's Proclamation of the Fourth Day of January 1757 : And likewife, That the Rewards of Two Pounds for every Able, and Twenty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, be continued to be paid to any Perfons who shall, on or before the faid Twenty Eighth Day of February next, difcover any Seaman or Seamen who fhall conceal themfelves, fo as fuch Seaman or Seamen be taken for His Majefty's Service. Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.

Petersbourg, Dec. 5. Yesterday the Empress was prefent at the Confectation of the Chappel in Count Worenzow's new House, and dined there afterwards; and upon this Occasion her Imperial Majefty was pleafed, in the most gracious Manner, to declare that Minister Great Chancellor.

Petersbourg, Dec. 8. Wednesday last, being the Anniverfary of the Empress's Accession to the Throne, there was a very numerous Court in the Morning, and at Night her Majefty fupped with her Life-Guard : There was a Supper likewife in the Great Duke's Apartment for the Foreign Ministers, and the Persons of the first two Classes. Upon that Occasion her Majefty was pleafed to give the Blue Ribband of Ruffia to the three Generals in Chief, Soltikow, Fermor, and Brown; of which the first only was prefent: And the Order of St. Alexander Newski was conferred on the Lieutenant Generals, Glebow, Weieykow, and Prince of Georgia ; and M. Glebow, Procureur of the Senate, had the Order of St. Anne given him by the Great Duke.

Hamburg, Jan. 5. Count Dohna, has ad-vanced with the Pruflian Army under his Command, thro' the Dutchy of Mechlenbourg into Swedish Pomerania, and, as it is reported, had taken Poffession of the Town of Damgarden, after a Refistance of fome Hours.

And in regard the Committing of fuch Offences as aforefaid are greatly encouraged by divers Perfons as Acceffaries thereto, who knowingly affift, maintain, councel, or advife the Committing of fuch Acts of Piracy, and also by Persons who receive Goods to piratically taken, and entertain and conceal Offenders, knowing them to have committed fuch Robberies :

Their Lordships therefore, in order to detect or bring to Justice the Persons guilty of such last mentioned Offences, are pleafed to promife a Reward of FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, unto or amongft fuch Perfon or Perfons as shall, within Three Months from this Time, difcover any one or more of the Offenders guilty of any fuch Offences laft mentioned, fo as fuch Offender or Offenders shall be apprehended and duly convicted thereof. Which faid respective Rewards before mentioned, shall be paid, clear of all Deductions whatloever, by Samuel Seddon, Elq; Solicitor of the Admiralty, immediately after the Conviction of such Offenders.

And as a further Encouragement, any of the faid Offenders, (other than and except the respective Commander or Commanders of any fuch Piratical Ships or Veffels) who shall discover any one or more of the faid Offenders, shall, on the Conviction of such Of-fender or Offenders so discovered, be intitled to His Majefty's most Gracious Pardon.

And their Lordships do also promife to grant, upon Request, to every Person, being a Seaman, who by making any such Discovery or Discoveries, as aforefaid, shall be inticled to either to the Whole, gracious Pardon.

IM Y Lords Commiflioners of the Admiralty, having received authentick Information, that a Galliot or Veffel, called the Juffrow Christina Eli-zabeth of Lubeck, whereof Cafper Muntzenberger was Mafter, laden with different Kinds of Goods and Merchandize, belonging to the Subjects of the Empres of Ruffia, and bound from Rouen to St. Peterfbourgo was, in the Course of her said Voyage, on the 18th Day of September laft, boarded three feveral Times by the Crews, or Part of the Crews, of fix English Ships or Veffels, being, or pretending to be Pri-vateers; and that at the first of those Times, viz... about One a-Clock in the Afternoon of that Day, fome of the Crews of the faid English Ships boarded the faid Galliot off Dungeness, and opening the Fore Hatchway, were into the Hold, and broke open a great many Cafes, and Packs of Merchandize, and unlawfully took, and carried away, great Quantities of Velvets, Silks, Siik-Stockings, Gloves, Confectionary Goods, and one whole Bale of Silk : And that between Three and Four a Clock in the fame Afternoon, being off Dover, the faid Galliot was again boarded by the Crews, or Part of the Crews, of three other English Ships, who being in Company, went rogether into the Hold, and rummaged the faid Galliot, and unlawfully took, and carried away, fome Silk, and Silk-Stockings, Part of which they wrapped about their Bodies, and put the reft into their Pockets, and also took away a Sword : And that foon afterwards, on the fame Day, the faid Galliot was a third Time boarded by the Crew, or Part of the Crew of another English Ship, who went into the Hold, broke open feveral Cafes, and unlawfully took, and carried away, two Boatloads of Merchandize, confifting of Men and Women's Velvets, Silk, embroidered Cloaths, Silk-Stocking:, Leather Gloves, French-Plate Candle-Ricks, fome Swords, and Hangers, Bottles of Cor-dials, Perfumes, and Confectionary and other Goods ; and then beat feveral of the faid Galliot's Crew, and confined the faid Mafter in his Cabbin, placing Centry over him with Piffols :

Their Lordships therefore, in order to discover and bring to Juffice, the Perfons guilty of the Piratical Offences above-mentioned, are pleased to pro-mise a Reward of FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, without any Deduction, unto or amongst such Per-fon or Perfons, as shall, within three Months from this Time, discover any one or more of the Offenders concerned in Committing all or any of the Piracies above-mentioned, fo as fuch Offender or Offenders shall be apprehended and duly convicted thereof : Which Reward shall be paid by Samuel Seddon, Efq; Solicitor of the Admiralty, immediately after the Conviction of fuch Offender or Offenders.
