A Placart has been published, in which the King makes known his most providential Escape on the 3d of September last, when he was attacked, at Eleven o'Clock at Night, near the Palace, by three of the Conspirators, armed with three Blunderbusses, loaded with large Shot; one of the Blunderbusses missed Fire, but the others made two large Holes in the Back of the Carriage the King was in, and wounded him in the Arm, of which his Majesty is now happily recovered, without the least Hurt remaining.

The fame Placart promiles certain Honours and Rewards for the Difcovery of any of the Criminals, with a Pardon to any of the Accomplices, except the Principals.

His Moft Faithful Majefty has refumed the Government of his Kingdom.

within Three Months from this Time, discover any one or more of the Offenders guilty of any such Afts of Piracy as aforesaid, so as such Offender or Offenders shall be apprehended and duly convisted thereof.

And in regard the Committing of fuch Offences as aforefaid are greatly encouraged by divers Perfons as Accelfaries thereto, who knowingly affift, maintain, councel, or advife the Committing of fuch Acts of Piracy, and alfo by Perfons who receive Goods fo piratically taken, and entertain and conceal Offenders, knowing them to have committed fuch Robberies :

Their Lordships therefore, in order to detect or bring to Justice the Persons guilty of such last mentioned Offences, are pleased to promise a Reward of FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, unto or amongst such Person or Persons as shall, within Three Months from this Time, discover any one or more of the Offenders guilty of any such Offences last mentioned, so as such Offender or Offenders shall be apprehended and duly convicted thereof. Which sald respective Rewards before mentioned, shall be paid, clear of all Deductions whatsoever, by Samuel Seddon, Esq; Solicitor of the Admiralty, immediately after the Conviction of such Offenders.

And as a further Encouragement, any of the faid Offenders, (other than and except the respective Commander or Commanders of any such Piratical Ships or Vessels) who shall discover any one or more of the faid Offenders, shall, on the Conviction of such Offender or Offenders fo discovered, be intitled to His Majessy's most Gracious Pardon.

And their Lordhips do alfo promife to grant, upon Requeft, to every Perfon, being a Seaman, who by making any fuch Difcovery or Difcoveries, as aforefaid, fhall be intitled to either to the Whole, or to any Part or Parts of any of the above-mentioned Rewards) an abfolute Protection, to prevent his being imprefied into His Majefty's Sea Service, during this prefent War with France.

MY Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, having received authentick Information, that a Galliot or Veffel, called the Juffrow Christina Elizabeth of Lubeck, whereof Casper Muntzenberger was Master, laden with different Kinds of Goods and Merchandize, belonging to the Subjects of the Empress of Russia, and bound from Rouen to St. Petersbourg, was, in the Course of her said Voyage, on the 18th Day of September last, boarded three several Times by the Crews, or Part of the Crews, of six English Ships or Vessels, being, or pretending to be Privateers; and that at the first of those Times, viz. about One a-Clock in the Asternoon of that Day, fome of the Crews of the faid English Ships boarded the faid Galliot off Dungeness, and opening the Fore

Fore Hatchway, went into the Hold, and broke open a great many Cafes, and Packs of Merchandize, and unlawfully took, and carried away, great Quantities of Velvets, Silks, Silk-Stockings, Gloves, Confectionary Goods, and one whole Bale of Silk: And that between Three and Four a Clock in the fame Afternoon, being off Dover, the faid Galliot was again boarded by the Crews, or Part of the Crews, of three other English Ships, who being in Company, went together into the Hold, and rummaged the faid Galliot, and unlawfully took, and carried away, fome Silk, and Silk-Stockings, Part of which they wrapped about their Bodies, and put o the reft into their Pockets, and also took away a Sword : And that foon afterwards, on the fame Day, the faid Galliot was a third Time boarded by the Crew, or Part of the Crew of another English Ship, who went into the Hold, broke open feveral Cafes, and unlawfully took, and carried away, two Boatloads of Merchandize, confifting of Men and Women's Velvets, Silk, embroidered Cloaths, Silk-Stockings, Leather Gloves, French-Plate Candleflicks, some Swords, and Hangers, Bottles of Cordials, Perfumes, and Confectionary and other Goods ; and then beat feveral of the faid Galliot's Crew, and confined the faid Mafter in his Cabbin, placing a Centry over him with Piftols :

Their Lordships therefore, in order to discover and bring to Justice, the Persons guilty of the Piratical Offences above-mentioned, are pleafed to promife a Reward of FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, without any Deduction, unto or amongst fuch Perfon or Persons, as shall, within three Months from this Time, discover any one or more of the Offenders concerned in Committing all or any of the Piracies above-mentioned, fo as, fuch Offender or Offenders shall be apprehended and duly convicted thereof : Which Reward shall be paid by Samuel Seddon, Efq; Solicitor of the Admiralty, immediately after the Conviction of fuch Offender or Offenders.

And as a further Encouragement, any of the faid Offenders, (other than and except the respective Commander or Commanders of any of the abovementioned English Ships or Veffels) who shall discover any one or more, other of the faid Offenders, shall, on the Conviction of the Offender or Offenders fo difcovered, be likewife entitled to His Majefty's most gracious Pardon.
