The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council, of the Seventh of November laft, For paying the respective Bounties therein mentioned, to all Able and Ordinary Seamen, and allo to all Able-bodied Landmen, who fhould voluntarily enter themfelves in His Majefty's Royal Navy ; and likewife for paying the Rewards to Perfons difcovering Seamen who should conceal themselves, will expire upon the Thirtieth Day of this Instant December ; And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, That the Bounties and Rewards thereby given, fhould be continued to be paid for fome Time longer; - His Majefty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby Order, That the Bounties of Three Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years; and of Thirty Shillings for every Able-bodied Landman, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, be continued to be paid to fuch Seamen and Landmen refpectively, who shall, on or before the Twenty Eighth Day of February next, enter themfelves in the Royal Navy, in the Manner directed by His Majefty's Proclamation of the Fourth Day of January 1757: And likewife, That the Rewards of Two Pounds for every Able, and Twenty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, be continued to be paid to any Perfons who fhall, on or before the faid Twenty Eighth Day of February next, difcover any Seaman or Seamen who fhall conceal themfelves, fo as fuch Seaman or Seamen be taken for His Majesty's Service. Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.

> Privateers : Their Lordships therefore, in order to detect and Perfores guilty of fuch Piracies bring to Justice the Perfons guilty of fuch Piracies and Robberies, (in Violation of the Laws of Na. tions in general, and of this Kingdom in varticular, and to the great Difhonour thereof) are pleafed to promife a Reward of FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, unto or amongst fuch Person or Persons as shall, within Three Months from this Time, discover any one or more of the Offenders guilty of any fuch Acts of Piracy as aforefaid, fo as fuch Offender or Offenders shall be apprehended and duly convicted thereof.

And in regard the Committing of fuch Offences as aforefaid are greatly encouraged by divers Perfons as Acceffaries thereto, who knowingly affift, maintain, councel, or advife the Committing of such Acts of Piracy, and also by Persons who receive Goods fo piratically taken, and entertain and conceal Offenders, knowing them to have committed fuch Robberies

Their Lordships therefore, in order to detect or bring to Justice the Persons guilty of such last mentioned Offences, are pleafed to promife a Reward of FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, unto or amongst fuch Perfon or Perfons as shall, within Three Months from this Time, discover any one or more of the Offenders guilty of any fuch Offences laft mentioned, fo as fuch Offender or Offenders shall be apprehended and duly convicted thereof. Which faid respective Rewards before mentioned, shall be paid, clear of all Deductions whatfoever, by Samuel Seddon, Esq; Solicitor or the Admiralty, immediately after the Conviction of fuch Offenders.

And as a further Encouragement, any of the faid Offenders, (other than and except the respective Commander or Commanders of any fuch Piratical Ships or Veffels) who shall discover any one or more of the faid Offenders, shall, on the Conviction of fuch Offender or Offenders so discovered, be intitled to His Majesty's most Gracious Pardon.

And their Lordfhips do alfo promife to grant, upon Requeft, to every Perfon, being a Seaman, who by making any fuch Difcovery or Difcoveries, as aforefaid, shall be intitled to either to the Whole, or to any Part or Parts of any of the above-mentioned Rewards) an absolute Protection, to prevent his being impressed into His Majesty's Sea Service, during this prefent War with France.
