Their Lordships therefore, in order to detect and bring to Justice the Perfons guilty of fuch Piracies and Robberies, (in Violation of the Laws of Na tions in general, and of this Kingdom in particular, and to the great Diffeonour thereof) are pleased to promise a Reward of FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, unto or amongit fuch Perion or Perfons as shall, within Three Months from this Time, dilcover any one or more of the Offenders guilty of any fuch Acts of Piracy as aforelaid, fo as fuch Offender or Offenders shall be apprehended and duly convicted thereof.

And in regard the Committing of fuch Offences as aforefaid are greatly encouraged by divers Per-fons as Acceffaries thereto, who knowingly affift, maintain, councel, or advife the Committing of fucn Acts of Piracy, and also by Persons who receive Goods to piratically taken, and entertain and conceal Offenders, knowing them to have committed fuch Robberies

Their Lordships therefore, in order to detect or bring to Justice the Persons guilty of such last mentioned Offences, are pleafed to promife a Reward of FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, unto or amongft fuch Perfon or Perfons as shall, within Three Months from this Time, discover any one or more of the Offenders guilty of any fuch Offences laft mentioned, fo as fuch Offender or Offenders shall be apprehended and duly convicted thereof. Which faid respective Rewards before mentioned, shall be paid, clear of all Deductions whatfoever, by Samuel Seddon, Efq; Solicitor of the Admiralty, immediately after the Conviction of fuch Offenders.

And as a further Encouragement, any of the faid Offenders, (other than and except the respective Commander or Commanders of any such Piratical Ships or Veffels) who shall difcover any one or more of the faid Offenders, shall, on the Conviction of fuch Offender or Offenders fo difcovered, be intitled to His Majefty's most Gracious Pardon.

And their Lordships do also promise to grant, upon Request, to every Person, being a Seaman, (who by making any fuch Discovery or Discoveries, as aforefaid, shall be insistled to either to the Whole, or to any Part or Parts of any of the above-nientioned Rewards) an absolute Protection, to prevent his being impressed into His Majesty's Sea Service, during this prefent War with France.

Whereas by the Eleventh Article of His Majefly's Instructions given to Commanders of Merchant Ships and Veffels, with the Letters of Marque against France, it is directed that they shall keep a Correspondence by all Conveniences, and upon all Occasions, with the Commissioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or their Secretary, and not only to give an Account of their Captures or Proceed-ings, but also of all they shall discover by any Means whatever concerning the Designs of the Enemy, their Fleets, Ships or Veffels, and of their Stations.

And whereas by the Fifteenth Article of the aforefaid Instructions it is likewise directed, that the faid Commanders shall, by every Opportunity, send exact Copies of their Journals to the Secretary of the Admiralty.

To both which Articles very little, if any Regard has been paid by feveral of the Commanders of Merchant Ships and Veffels baving Letters of Marque, and it being a Matter of the utmost Importance that the fame should be firitly complied with ;

My Lords Commiffioners of the Admiralty do therefore give Notice to the faid Commanders, and all other Perfons concerned, that they will direct the Proctor of the Admiralty, to proceed according to Law, against all fuch as do not punctually comply with His Majesly's Inftructions before mentioned.
