The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS His Majefty was pleafed, by His Order in Council of the 20th of February laft, to fignify His Royal Pleasure, that the Bounties of Three

Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman and Able Bodied Landman, fit for His Majefty's Service, fhould be continued to be paid to all fuch who fhould voluntarily enter themfelves on Board any of His Ships of War, on or before the 21st Day of April next; and that the faid Bounties should be paid to them respectively, immedi-ately after their first Muster on Board the Ships into which they fhould fo enter-And whereas fince the Iffuing the aforementioned Order, His Majesty hath been given to understand, that there are at this Time disperfed in various Parts of the Kingdom, great Numbers of Seamen and Seafaring Men, many of whom may be inclined to enter into the Service, and reap the Benefit of His Majesty's faid Bounties, provided that the Justices of the Peace, or other Magistrates (near to whom the faid Seamen may refide) were authorized and directed to receive them, and to caufe them to be conducted to any of the Ships of War; — His Majefty hath therefore been pleafed, with the Advice of His Privy-Council, to Require and Command all the Juffices of the Peace, and Mayors of Cities and Towns throughout the Kingdom of England and Wales, and likewife the Provofts of Edinburgh, Glafgow, and Aberdeen in Scotland, to receive all fuch Seamen and Seafaring Men, who fhall appear before them, and offer to enter as Voluntiers, in Cafe they are of Health and Ability fit for His Majefty's Service, and not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, and to grant to each Seaman a Certificate of fuch his voluntary Offer, and to caule them to be conducted, by proper Perfons, to fome Sea Officer employed in raifing Men on Shore, or to the nearest Sea Port Town, in order to be put on Board any of His Majefty's Ships of War, which Sea Officer on Shore, or the Captains of fuch Ships, are directed to pay to every fuch Seaman, after his being fo put on Board (upon

MY Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty having received many repeated Complaints of divers outragious Acts of Piracy committed on Board great Numbers of Ships, as well English as Neutral, failing in the English Channel, by the Crews of Ships or Veffels being or pretending to be English Privateers :

Their Lordships therefore, in order to detect and bring to Justice the Perfons guilty of fuch Piracies and Robberies, (in Violation of the Laws of Na-tions in general, and of this Kingdom in particular, tions in general, and of this Kingdom in particular; and to the great Difhonour thereof) are pleafed to promife a Reward of FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, unto or amongft fuch Perfon or Perfons as shall, within Three Months from this Time, difcover any one or more of the Offenders guilty of any fuch Afts of Piracy as aforefaid, fo as fuch Offender or Offenders shall be apprehended and duly convicted thereof.

And in regard the Committing of luch Offences as aforefaid are greatly encouraged by divers Perfons as Accellaries thereto, who knowingly affift, maintain, councel, or advife the Committing of fuch Acts of Piracy, and also by Persons who receive Goods fo piratically taken, and entertain and conceal Offenders, knowing them to have committed fuch Robberies :

Their Lordthips therefore, in order to detect or bring to Justice the Perfons guilty of fuch last mentioned Offences, are pleafed to promife a Reward of FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, unto or amongst fuch Perfon or Perfons as shall; within Three Months from this Time, discover any one or more of the Offenders guilty of any such Offences last mentioned, so as such Offender or Offenders shall be apprehended and duly convicted thereof. Which faid respective Rewards before mentioned, shall be paid, clear of all Deductions whatfoever, by Samuel Seddon, Efq; Solicitor of the Admiralty, imme: diately after the Conviction of fuch Offenders.

And as a further Encouragement, any of the faid Offenders, (other than and except the respective Commander or Commanders of any fuch Piratical Ships or Veffels) who shall discover any one or more of the faid Offenders, shall, on the Conviction of such Offender



Senders or Offenders to discovered, be intitled to for that Purpose, and unless the Stores to surchosed His Majesty's most Gracious Pardon.

And their Lordships do also promise to grant, upon Requeft, to every Perfon, being a Seaman, (who by making any fuch Discovery or Discoveries, as aforetaid, shall be institled to either to the Whole, or to any Part or Parts of any of the above-mentioned Reward) an abiolute Protection, to prevent his being impressed into His Majesty's Sea Service, during this prefent War with France.

Whereas by the Eleventh Article of His Maj fly's Infructions given to Commanders of Merchant Ships and Veffels, with the Letters of Marque again & France, it is directed that they fiall keep a Correspondence by all Conveniences, and upon all Occosions, with the Commissioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or their Sceretary, and not only to give an Account of their Captures or Proceedings, but also of all they shall discover by ony Means whatever concerning the Designs of the Enemy, their Fleets, Ships or Viste's, and of their Stations.

And whereas by the Fifteenth Article of the aforefaid Instructions it is likewise directed, that the said Commanders shall, by every Opportunity, find exact Copies of their Journals to the Secretary of the Admiralty.

To both which Articles very little, if any Regard has been paid by feveral of the Commanders of Marchant Ships and Veffels bawing Letters of Marque, and it being a Matter of the utmost Importance that the fame spould be strictly complied with;
