AT the Court at St. James's, the 9th Day of March, 1759,

PRESENT,

The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS His Majefty was pleafed, by His Order in Council of the 20th of February laft, to fignify His Royal Pleafure, that the Bounties of Three

Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman and Able Bodied Landman, fit for His Majefty's Service, fhould be continued to be paid to all fuch who should voluntarily enter themselves on Board any of His Ships of War, on or before the 21st Day of April next ; and that the faid Bounties should be paid to them respectively, immedi-ately after their first Muster on Board the Ships into which they fhould fo enter-And whereas fince the Iffuing the aforementioned Order, His Majefty hath been given to understand, that there are at this Time disperfed in various Parts of the Kingdom, great Numbers of Seamen and Seafaring Men, many of whom may be inclined to enter into the Service, and reap the Benefit of His Majefty's faid Bounties, provided that the Justices of the Peace, or other Magistrates (near to whom the faid Seamen may refide) were authorized and directed to receive them, and to caufe them to be conducted to any of the Ships of War ;-His Majefty hath therefore been pleased, with the Advice of His Privy-Council, to Require and Command all the Justices of the Peace, and Mayors of Cities and Towns throughout the Kingdom of England and Wales, and likewife the Provofts of Edinburgh, Glafgow, and Aberdeen in Scotland, to receive all fuch Seamen and Seafaring Men, who fhall appear before them, and offer to enter as Voluntiers, in Cafe they are of Health and Ability fit for His Majesty's Service, and not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, and to grant to each Seaman a Certificate of fuch his voluntary Offer, and to caufe them to be conducted, by proper Perfons, to fome Sea Officer employed in raifing Men on Shore, or to the nearest Sea Port Town, in order to be put on Board any of His Majesty's Ships of War, which Sea Officer on Shore, or the Captains of fuch Ships, are directed to pay to every fuch

Seaman, after his being fo put on Board (upon producing the Certificate aforementioned) the faid Bounties of Three Pounds to every able Seaman, and of Thirty Shillings for every ordinary Seaman; — And to the End that His Majefty's Directions given herein may be made known to all Perfons concerned, His Majefty has therefore ordered, that the fame fhould be publifhed in the London Gazette.

Rome, Feb. 17. The Roman Catholick Ec-clefiafticks, in the States poffeffed by the King of Pruffia, have acquainted the Pope, that His Pruffian Majefty has cauled an Edict to be publifhed, requiring them to pay a Tax of Ten per Cent. on their Revenues, in the fame Manner as is exacted by the Empress Queen in her Dominions, in Confequence of a Bull which the Pope has granted to her Imperial Majefty for that Purpole. The King of Portugal has re-quefted the Pope to take upon himfelf the Chaffifing of the Clergy under Arrest, that are concerned in the late Conspiracy against his Perfon, but nothing has been determined as yet on The Neapolitan Troops are enthis Subject. camped on the Borders of the Ecclefiaftical State, which has occasioned the Pope to order a fufficient Number of the Militia to be ready for any Service that may be required.

Florence, Feb. 24. On the 9th Inftant, as the Snow Bethia, an English Veffel, was entering into the Port of Leghorn, the was attacked and taken by a fmall French Privateer, within the Jurifdiction of the Port ; on which Account the Fortifications fired at the Frenchman, who is detained in that Port, with her Prize, till the Regency of Tuscany decides the Affair. On the 15th, 500 Recruits, drafted out of the Tufcan Battalions in Garrifon at Leghorn, Porto-Ferraio, and this Capital, marched for Germany, to fupply the Deficiency of the Tufcan Troops. On the 18th and 20th anchored at Leghorn, His Britannick Majefty's Ships the Glafgow, Lyme, Ambuscade, and Gibraltar, for Refreshments.
