HIS Day, the Lords being met, a Meffage was fent to the Honourable House of Commons by Mr. Quarme, Deputy Gentleman-Ufher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that The Lords, authorized by Virtue of His Majefty's Commiffion, for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do defire the immediate Attendance of this Honourable House in the House of Peers, to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the faid Commiffion, impowering his Royal Highness the Duke of Cumberland, the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord Keeper of the Great Seal, the Lord Prefident of the Council, the Lord Privy Seal, and feveral other Lords, to declare and notify the Royal Affent to the faid Bills was read accordingly, and the Royal Affent given to,

An Act for granting to His Majesty a Subsidy of Poundage upon certain Goods and Merchandizes to be imported into this Kingdom, and an additional Inland Duty on Coffee and Chocolate; and for raifing the Sum of Six Millions, Six Hundred Thouland Pounds, by Way Annuities and a Lottery, to be charged on the said Subfidy and additional Inland Duty.

An Act to permit the free Importation of Cattle from Ireland for a limited Time.

HEREAS His Majefty was pleafed, by HisOrder in Council of the 20th of February last, to fignify His Royal Pleafure, that the Bounties of Three

Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman and Able Bodied Landman, fit for His Majefty's Service, fhould be continued to be paid to all fuch who fhould voluntarily enter themfelves on Board any of His Ships of War, on or before the 21ft Day of April next; and that the faid Bounties fhould be paid to them respectively, immediately after their first Muster on Board the Ships into which they fhould fo enter-And whereas. fince the Issuing the aforementioned Order, His Majefty hath been given to understand, that there are at this Time difperfed in various Parts of the Kingdom, great Numbers of Seamen and Seafaring Men, many of whom may be inclined to enter into the Service, and reap the Benefit of His Majefty's faid Bounties, provided that the Juffices of the Peace, or other Magistrates (near to whom the faid Seamen may refide) were authorized and directed to receive them, and to caule them to be conducted to any of the Ships of War ;-His Majesty hath therefore been pleased, with the Advice of His Privy-Council, to Require and Command all the Juffices of the Peace, and Mayors of Cities and Towns throughout the Kingdom of England and Wales, and likewife the Provofts of Edinburgh, Glafgow, and Aberdeen in Scotland, to receive all fuch Seamen and Seafaring Men, who fhall appear before them, and offer to enter as Voluntiers, in Cafe they are of Health and Ability fit for His Majefty's Service, and not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, and to grant to each Seaman a Certificate of fuch his voluntary Offer, and to caufe them to

be conducted, by proper Perfons, to fome Sea Officer employed in raifing Men on Shore, or to the nearest Sea Port Town, in order to be put on Board any of His Majesty's Ships of War, which Sea Officer on Shore, or the Captains of fuch Ships, are directed to pay to every fuch Seaman, after his being fo put on Board (upon producing the Certificate aforementioned) the faid Bounties of Three Pounds to every able Seaman, and of Thirty Shillings for every ordi-nary Seaman; — And to the End that His Majesty's Directions given herein may be made known to all Perfons concerned, His Majefty has therefore ordered, that the fame fhould be published in the London Gazette.

Florence, March 17. A great Number of Workmen are employed in Repairing and Augmenting the Fortifications at Leghorn. The Emperor has named the Captains, Lieutenants, and Sub-Lieutenants of the Troop of 300 Dragoons, which is almost compleated. Agi Demetry, Minister from the Bey of Algiers, who in Auguft last went from hence to Vienna, returned here on the 9th Inftant from that Capital, on his Way to Leghorn, to embark for the Coaft of Barbary : He is defrayed at the Emperor's Expence, and carries many rich Prefents from the Emperor to the Bey.

And in regard the Committing of fuch Offences as aforefaid are greatly encouraged by divers Perfons as Acceffaries thereto, who knowingly affift, maintain, councel, or advife the Committing of fuch Acts of Piracy, and also by Persons who receive Goods fo piratically taken, and entertain and conceal Offenders, knowing them to have committed - fuch Robberies

Their Lordships therefore, in order to detect or bring to Juffice the Perfons guilty of fuch last men-tioned Offences, are pleased to promise a Reward of FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, unto or amongfi fuch Perfon or Perfons as shall, within Three Months from this Time, discover any one or more

of the Offenders guilty of any fach Offences fat mentioned, fo as fuch Offender or Offenders fhall be apprehended and duly convicted thereof. Which faid respective Rewards before mentioned, shall be paid, clear of all Deductions whatfoever, by Samuel Seddon, Esq; Solicitor of the Admiralty, immediately after the Conviction of fuch Offenders.

And as a further Encouragement, any of the faid Offenders, (other than and except the refpective Commander or Commanders of any fuch Piratical Ships or Veffels) who shall difcover any one or more of the faid Ottenders, shall, on the Conviction of fuch Offender or Offenders so discovered, be intitled to His Majesty's most Gracious Fardon.

And their Lordinips do also promise to grant, upon Request, to every Person, being a Seaman, (who by making any fuch Difeovery or Difeoveries, as aforefaid, shall be intitled to either to the Whole, or to any Part or Parts of any of the above-mentioned Rewards) an absolute Protection, to prevent his being impressed into His Msjesty's dez Service, during this prefent War with France.
