The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS His Majefty was pleafed, by His Order in Council of the 20th of February last, to direct, that the Bounties of Three Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, and of Thirty Shillings for every Able Bodied Land-man, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, flould be continued to be paid, immediately after the first Mufter, to fuch Seamen and Landmen respectively, who should, on or before the 21st Day of this Inftant April, enter themfelves in the Royal Navy; and that the Rewards of Two Pounds for every Able, and Twenty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fhould likewife be continued to be paid to fuch Perfon or Perfons, who should, on or before the Day above-mentioned, discover any concealed Seamen, fo that fuch Seamen should be taken for His Majefty's Service; Which Time being now near expiring, His Majefty doth hereby order, with the Advice of His Privy-Council, that the faid Bounties and Rewards be continued to be paid from the faid 21st of this Instant April, until the 2d Day of June next. And whereas fince the Isluing the aforementioned Order of the 20th of February, His Majesty had been given to understand, that there were dispersed in various Parts of the Kingdom, great Numbers of Seamen and Seafaring Men, fome of whom were endeavouring to conceal themfelves in order to avoid His Majefty's Service, and that others of them might be inclined to enter as Voluntiers into the Service, and reap the Benefit of His Majesty's aforementioned Bounties, provided that the Juffices of the Peace, or other Magistrates (near to whom the faid Seamen refide) were authorized and directed to receive them, and to caufe them to be conducted to any of the Ships of War-His Majefty was thereupon pleafed, by His Orders in Council of the 9th of March last, to Require and Command all the Juffices of the Peace, and Mayors of Cities and Towns throughout the Kingdom of England and Wales, and likewife the Provofts of Edinburgh, Glafgow, and Aberdeen, in Scot-land, to caufe frict Search to be made, within their respective Jurisdictions, for all ftraggling

Seamen and Seafaring Men, fit for His Majefty's [ Price Three-Pence. ]

A T the Court at St. James's, the 14th Service, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, and to take them up, and fend them, by careful Conductors to a Sea Officer employed in raifing Men on Shore, or to the nearest Sea Port Town, in order to their being put on Board His Majefty's Ships of War: Which Conductors were to be paid by the faid Sea Officer on Shore, or the Captains of fuch Ships to whom fuch Seamen should be delivered, Twenty Shillings for each Seaman, and Six-pence a Mile for each Man, for every Mile they might refpectively Travel : — And the faid Juffices, and other Magistrates, were thereby likewife required and commanded, to receive all fuch Seamen and Seafaring Men, who fhould appear before them, and offer to enter as Voluntiers, in Cafe they were of Health and Ability fit for His Majefty's Service, and not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, and to grant to each Seaman a Certificate of fuch his voluntary Offer, and to caule them to be conducted, in like Manner, and with the fame Allowances, as above directed with respect to Straggling Seamen :--And the Sea Officer on Shore, or the Captains of such Ships, to whom such Voluntier Seamen should be delivered, were directed to pay to every fuch Seaman, after his being fo put on Board (upon producing the Certificate aforementioned) the Bounties of Three Pounds to every able Seaman, and of Thirty Shillings to every ordinary Seaman ; - And His Majesty judging it neceffary for His Service, that all the afore-recited Directions, contained in His Majefty's faid Orders in Council, of the 9th of March laft, should be continued until the 2d Day of June next, doth hereby Order, with the Advice of His Privy Council, that the fame be continued. and remain in full Force, until the faid 2d Day -----Whereof all the of June next accordinglyaforefaid Juffices of the Peace, and other Magiftrates, as likewife all other Perfons, whom it may concern, are to take Notice, and yield due Obedience hereunto.

HEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council of the 15th of September laft, for prohibiting the exporting out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coaftwife, Gunpowder, Salt Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire upon the 29th Day

of

of this Inftant April-And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some longer Time, -His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby Order, Require, Prohibit and Command, that no Perfon or Persons whatsoever (except the Master General, Lieutenant General, or principal Officers of the Ordnance for His Majefty's Service) do, at any Time during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the said 29th Day of this Infant April, prefume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwife, any Gunpowder, Salt Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship, or lade, any Gunpowder, Salt Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on Board any Ship or Vefiel, in order to transporting the fame into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the fame Coastwife, without Leave or Permiffion in that Behalf, first obtained from His Majefty, or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and fuffering the refpective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act paffed in the Twenty Ninth Year of His Majefty's Reign, entituled, "An Act to impower "His Majefty to prohibit the Exportation of " Salt Petre, and to enforce the Law for em-" powering His Majesty to prohibit the Expor-tation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms " and Ammunition; and also to empower His " Majefty to reftrain the carrying Coaftwile of " Salt Petre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms " or Ammunition "-And the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treasury, the Commiffioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Lieutenant General and principal Officers of the Ordnance, and His Majefty's Secretary at War, are to give the neceffary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain. ### Admiralty Office, May 1, 1759.

Extract of a Letter from Captain Faulkner, of His Majestp's Ship Windsor, of 60 Guns, to Mr. Clevland, dated at Lisbon, April 8.

The 27th paft we discovered four large Ships to Leeward ; on giving them Chafe, they drew into a Line of Battle a-head, at the Diffance of about a Cable's length afunder, and remained in that Situation till we had engaged the Sternmoft Ship near an Hour, when the three Headmost made all the Sail they could from us; on feeing which, the Ship we were engaged with ftruck She proved to be Le Duc de her Colours. Chartres, pierced for 60 Guns, had 24 French Twelve Pounders mounted, and 294 Men, 28 The of which were killed, and 18 wounded. Windfor had in this Action one Man killed, and fix wounded. The Prifoners inform me, the Lading of Le Duc de Chartres confifts of Sixty Tons of Gunpowder, One hundred and fifty Tons of Cordage, Flour, Sail Cloth, Wines, &с.

The other three Ships that run off were, Le Maffac, pierced for 70 Guns, had 26 Twelve Pounders mounted, and 300 Men; the East-India Company, pierced for 54 Guns, had 24 Twelve Pounders mounted, and 274 Men; and the St. Luke, pierced for 24 Guns, had 18

Twelve Pounders mounted, and 200 Men: They all belonged to the French Eaft-India Company, failed from Port l'Orient the 22d of March, and were bound to Pondicherry.

Y Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty having received many repeated Complaints of divers outragious Acts of Piracy committed on Board great Numbers of Ships, as well English as Neutral, failing in the English Channel, by the Crews of Ships or Veffels being or pretending to be English Privateers :

Their Lordships therefore, in order to detect and bring to Juffice the Perfons guilty of fuch Piracies and Robberies, (in Violation of the Laws of Na. tions in general, and of this Kingdom in particular, and to the great Difhonour thereof) are pleafed to promife a Reward of FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, unto or amongit fuch Perfon or Perfons as shall, within Three Months from this Time, discover any one or more of the Offenders guilty of any fuch Acts of Piracy as aforefaid, fo as fuch Offender or Offenders shall be apprehended and duly convicted thereof.

And in regard the Committing of fuch Offences as aforefaid are greatly encouraged by divers Perfons as Acceffaries thereto, who knowingly affift, maintain, councel, or advife the Committing of fuch Acts of Piracy, and also by Persons who receive Goods to piratically taken, and entertain and conceal Offenders, knowing them to have committed fuch Robberies :

Their Lordships therefore, in order to detect or bring to Juffice the Perfons guilty of fuch laft mentioned Offences, are pleafed to promife a Reward of FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, unto or amongst fuch Perfon or Perfons as shall, within Three Months from this Time, difcover any one or more of the Offenders guilty of any fuch Offences laft mentioned, fo as fuch Offender or Offenders shall be apprehended and duly convicted thereof. Which faid refpective Rewards before mentioned, shall be paid, clear of all Deductions whatfoever, by Samuel Seddon, Efq; Solicitor of the Admiralty, immediately after the Conviction of fuch Offenders.

And as a further Encouragement, any of the faid Offenders, (other than and except the respective Commander or Commanders of any fuch Piratical Ships or Veffels) who shall discover any one or more of the faid Ottenders, shall, on the Conviction of fuch Offender or Offenders fo discovered, be intitled to His Majefty's most Gracious Pardon.

And their Lordships do also promise to grant, upon Request, to every Person, being a Seaman, (who by making any fuch Difcovery or Difcoveries, as aforefaid, shall be intitled to either to the Whole, or to any Part or Parts of any of the above-mentioned Rewards) an absolute Protection, to prevent his being impressed into His Majesty's Sea Service, during this prefent War with France.
