PROCLAMATION,

For giving Encouragement to Seamen and Ablebodied Landmen to enter themselves on Board · His Majefly's Ships of War ; for granting Rewards for discovering such Seamen as shall conceal themselves; for pardoning fuch Seamen as have deferted, and shall return into the Service ; and also for taking up all flraggling Seamen.

THEREAS for the speedy Manning of Our Fleet, We did, by Our Order in Council of the Fourteenth of

April laft, amongst other Things, dired, that the Bounties of Three Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, and of Thirty Shillings for every Able ocdied Landman, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, should be continued to be paid, immediately after the first Muster, to such Seamen and Landmen refpectively, who fhould, on or before the Second Day of June next, enter themfelves in the Royal Navy; and that the Rewards of Two Pounds for every Able, and Twenty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fhould likewife be continued to be paid to fuch Perfon or Perfons, who fhould, on or before the faid S. cond Day of June next, offcover any concealed Seamen, fo that fuch Seamen fhould be taken for Our Service. ---- And whereas Our Service doth at this Time require a more speedy Supply of Seamen, Sea-faring Men, and Ablebodied Landmen, to ferve on Board Our Ships of War, and it being Our Royal Intention to give all due Encouragement to all fuch Seamen, Sea-faring Men, and Able-bodied Landmen, who fhall voluntarily enter themfelves in Our Service : We have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to revoke that Our former Order, and in lieu thereof to pub-lifh this Our Royal Proclamation; and We do hereby promise and declare, That the Bounties of FIVE POUNDS for every Able Seaman, and of Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, be paid to every fuch Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor un-der the Age of Twenty Years, who shall, on or before the Third Day of July next, voluntarily enter themselves to serve in Our Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of Our Ships, or the Chief Officers on Board fuch Tenders as shall be employed for raising Men for the Service of Our Royal Navy : And alfo that a Bounty of Thirty Shillings be paid to every Able-bodied Landman, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who shall, on or before the faid Third Day of July next, voluntarily enter themselves to serve in Our Royal Navy, either

with the Captains or Lieutenants of Our Ships, or the Chief Officers on Board fuch Tenders as shall be employed for raising Men for the Service of Our Royal Navy : And that the faid respective Sums be paid to all fuch Seamen and Landmen upon their being brought on Board Our Ships at any of Our Dock Yards in England, by the Clerks of the Cheque, or upon their being put on Board any Ship or Veffel appointed to receive Men at Leith or Greenock in Scotland, or at Dublin or Corke in Ireland, by the Captains or Commanders of the Ships or Veffels whereinto fuch Seamen or Landmen fhall be put, or by the Sea Officer employed in raifing Men on Shore. And for Prevention of any Abuses by any Persons leaving the Ships or Veffels to which they fhall belong, and entring themselves on Board any other Our Ships or Veffels, in order to obtain the faid Bounty-Money ; We do hereby declare and commatid, That fuch Seamen or Landmen, belonging to any of Our Ships or Vefiels, as shall absent themselves from any of the faid Ships or Veffels, to which they shall belong, and enter themselves on Board any other of Our Ships or Veffels, in order to obtain the faid Bounty, fhall not only lufe the Wages due to them in the Ships or Veffels they shall leave, but also be feverely punifhed according to their Demerits. And We do hereby further piomife and declare, That a Reward of Two Pounds for every Able, and Twenty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, shall be paid any Person who shall discover any Seaman or Seamen who may fecret themfelves, fo that fuch Seaman or Seamen fhall be taken for Our faid Service, on or before the faid Third Day of July next, by any of Our Sea Officers employed for raifing Men : The faid Rewards to be paid for any Seaman or Seamen fo discovered and taken, in and about London, by the Principal Officers and Commiffioners of Our Navy; and, at the Out Ports, by the Naval Officers, or Sea Officers employed in . raifing Men on Shore; immediately upon a Certificate being produced to the faid Principal Officers and Commiffioners of Our Navy, Naval Officers, or Sea Officers employed in raifing Men on Shore respectively, by the Person who may make Discovery of any Seaman or Seamen as aforefaid, certifying his Name, and the Name or Names and Number of Seamen procured in Confequence of his Difcovery ; and the faid Certificate to be given by fuch Officer as may take fuch Seaman or Seamen for Our Service, And as an Encouragement to fuch Seamen who may have deferted from Our Ships to return to the Service, We do somife Our most gracious Pardon to all fuch as fhall repair on Board any of Our Ships or Veffels by or before the Third Day of July next; and also to all such who have deferted, but are now belonging to fome one of Our Ships, (in which Ship they are hereby permitted to continue.)
