And animated by this, may be freadily purfue and firmly tread in those Glorious Paths which your Majesty hath never departed from.

May he live to instruct his Royal Descendants in those Important Lessons which your Majesty hath taught him; fo that Fortitude and Juffice, the diffinguifhing Virtues of your Illustrious Race, may continue to adorn the Crown upon their Heads to latest Posterity.
