Constantinople, June 2. The Ramazan and irram are finished. The most material Bairam are finished. Changes that have been made, are those of the Reis Efendi, Chiaufe Bafchi, and Selichtar Aga. The former is fucceeded by one Omer Efendi. Senek Mustapha Bascha is named to the Paschalyck of Aleppo : He is one of the Grand Seignor's Brothers-in-law. It is doubted whether he will not remain here, and name a Muffelim to act there. The Selichtar Aga, or Sword-bearer, is appointed Pafcha of the Morea. The Captain Pafcha is just on his Departure for his annual Visit to collect the Tribute.

Florence, June 23. On the 12th anchored at Leghorn from the Fleet off Toulon, His Britannick Majesty's Ship the Tartar's Prize, Capt. Baillie, Commander : And on the 13th failed His Britannick Majesty's Ship the Rainbow,

camped. Marshal de Contades's Camp was between Lipfpring and Offchlangen. On the Morning of the 1st Instant, a Imart Action paffed between the two Regiments of French Huffars, Turpin and Berchiny, and five Squadrons of Pruffian Huffars, in which the French loft about a Hundred and fifty Men killed and taken, and the reft were difperfed.

Extract of a Letter from Rear Admiral Rodney to Mr. Clevland, dated on Board His Majesty's Ship the Achilles off Haure de Grace, the

Oth of July, 1759. His Majefty's Ships and Bombs under my Command failed from St. Hellens in the Morning of the 2d Instant, and with a favourable Wind and moderate Weather anchored the following Day in the great Road off Havre, where having made a Disposition to put their Lordships Orders in Execution, the Bombs proceeded to Place themfelves in the narrow Channel of the River leading to Harfleur, it being the most proper and only Place to do Execution from. About Seven in the Evening two of the Bombs were flationed, as were all the reft early the next Morning, and continued to bombard for Fifty-two Hours without Intermission, with fuch Success, that the Town was feveral Times in Flames, and their Magazine of Stores for the Flat-bottom'd Boats burnt with very great Fury for upwards of Six Hours, notwithftanding the continual Efforts of feveral hundred Men to extinguish it. Many of the Boats were overturned and damaged by the Explosion of the Shells.

During the Attack, the Enemy's Troops ap-peared very numerous, were continually crecking new Batteries, and throwing up Entrenchments: Their Confternation was to great, that all the Inhabitants forfook the Town.

Notwithstanding this fmart Bombardment, I have the Pleasure to acquaint you, that the Damage done us by the Enemy has been very inconfiderable, though great Numbers of their Shot and Shells fell and burft among the Bombs and Boats.
