" Able-bodied Landmen, to enter themselves " on Board His Majesty's Ships of War; for " granting Rewards for difcovering fuch Sea-" men as fhall conceal themfelves ; for pardon-" ing fuch Seamen as have deferted, and fhall " return into the Service ; and also for taking " up all ftraggling Seamen", will expire on the Third Day of July next .--And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, that the feveral Encouragements thereby given, fhould remain and continue in Force for fome Time longer ; - It is therefore hereby ordered in Council, that the Time limited by His Majefty's aforementioned Proclamation be prolonged and extended from the faid Third Day of July next, to the Eighteenth Day of August following inclusive, and that the Bounties and Rewards thereby given and granted, be continued to be paid until the faid Eighteenth Day of August..... Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.

the faid Ships Crews. --- And whereas it is of the utmost Importance to prevent the Contagion being brought into this Kingdom, -• It is therefore hereby ordered in Council, That all Ships which are already arrived, or shall hereafter arrive in any of the Ports of this Kingdom, or of the Isles of Jersey, Guernsey, Alderney, Sack or Man, from those Seas, be strictly examined, whether they have had Communication with any of the fulpected Ships beforementioned, or whether they have touched at the Morea, the Coaft of Barbary, or any infected Place ; and in Cafe fuch Ships fhall appear to have had Communication with any of the faid fulpected Ships, or touched at any of the faid Places, that they be then put under the like Rules of Quarantine with those now subfifting upon Ships and Goods coming from Smyrna.—And the Lord^s Com-miffioners of His Majefty's Treafury, the Com-miffioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great-Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, and the Governors or Com-manders in Chief for the Time being of the faid respective Isles of Jersey, Guernsey, Alderney, Sark and Man, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may refpectively appertain.

Constantinople, June 2. The Ramazan and iram are finished. The most material Bairam are finished. Changes that have been made, are those of the Reis Efendi, Chiause Baschi, and Selichtar Aga. The former is fucceeded by one Omer Efendi. Senek Muftapha Bascha is named to the Paschalyck of Aleppo : He is one of the Grand Seignor's Brothers-in-law. It is doubted whether he will not remain here, and name a Muffelim to act there. The Selichtar Aga, or Sword-bearer, is appointed Pafcha of the Morea. The Captain Pafcha is just on his Departure for his annual Visit to collect the Tribute.
