HEREAS His Majefty hath received Information from His Envoy Extraordinary at the Court of Turin, that a Polacca, under Imperial Colours, from the Coaft of Barbary, is reported to have the Plague on Board, and is in those Seas, and has been seen off the Coaft of Provence near Marfeilles; and that the Mafter and feveral Paffengers and Seamen have died on Board : And His Majefty having likewife received Information from the Vice Conful at Genoa, that a Raguía Ship is arrived at Leghorn, and a Tuscan Ship at Marfeilles, both with foul Bills of Health from Alexandretta, and that the Contagion is got amongft the faid Ships Crews. --- And whereas it is of the utmost Importance to prevent the Contagion being brought into this Kingdom, -- It is therefore hereby ordered in Council, That all Ships which are already arrived, or fhall hereafter arrive in any of the Ports of this Kingdom, or of the Isles of Jerley, Guernsey, Alderney, Sark

or Man, from those Seas, be strictly examined, whether they have had Communication with any of the suspected Ships beforementioned, or whether they have touched at the Morez, the Coaft of Barbary, or any infected Place; and in Cafe fuch Ships shall appear to have had Communication with any of the faid fulpected Ships, or touched at any of the faid Places, that shey be then put under the like Rules of Quarantine with those now fubfifting upon Ships and Goods coming from Smyrna, ---- And the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treafury, the Com-miffioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great-Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief for the Time being of the faid respective Isles of Jersey, Guerniey, Alderney, Sark and Man, are to give the neceffary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.
