A^T the Court at Kenfington, the 24th Day of July, 1759,

PRESENT,

The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THEREAS His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council of the 2d of June, 1758, to direct, that for the better pre-venting the Plague from being brought into this Kingdom, all Privateers, and all Perfons, Goods and Merchandizes on Board the fame, coming from the Mediterranean, should make their Quarantine for Forty Days, and frictly conform themfelves in all Refpects to the Rules and Regulations required to be observed by Ships and Veffels coming from Smyrna, and other Parts of the Levant, and the Coaft of Barbary-And whereas His Majefty hath received Information that the Plague doth at this Time rage with great Violence in many Parts of the Levant, the Morea, and other adjacent Places; and it being apprehended that all Ships and Veffels in the Mediterranean, whether Traders, Cruizers, or others, may have Communication with the Ships and Veffels coming from fome of the faid infected Places-His Majesty doth therefore judge it neceffary, that the beforementioned Quarantine, laid upon Privateers cruizing in the Mediter-ranean, fhould be extended to all Ships and Veffels whatfoever, coming from or through the Mediterranean: And to that End, His Majefty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth hereby order, require, and command, that all Ships and Veffels whatfoever, coming from or through the Mediterranean, and all Perfons, Goods and Merchandizes on Board the fame, that are already arrived, or fhall hereafter arrive in any of the Ports of this Kingdom, or of the Isles of Jersey, Guernsey, Alderney, Sark or Man, do make their Quarantine for Forty Days, and do likewife ftrictly conform themfelves in all Respects to the Rules and Regulations required

to be obferved by Ships and Veffels coming from Smyrna, and other Parts of the Levant, and the Coaft of Barbary.—And the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treafury, the Commiffioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Mafter General of the Ordnance, His Majefty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief for the Time being of the faid refpective Ifles of Jerfey, Guernfey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, are to give the neceffary Directions herein, as to them may refpectively appertain.

PRESENT,

The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

IS Majefty, with the Advice of His Privy-Council, doth hereby D-clare and Order, That all fuch of His Faithful Subjects, who fhall Inlift themfelves as Soldiers in His Majefty's Land Service, from this 11th Day of July, fhall not be fent out of Great Britain, and fhall be entitled to their Difcharge in Three Years, or at the End of the War if they choofe it—And His Majefty doth hereby further Order, That all Soldiers, who may have Deferted before the Firft of June laft, fhall be pardoned for the fame, on Condition they join the Corps they laft ferved in by the 20th of August next—And in Cafe the Regiment they laft ferved in should be out of the Kingdom, that they may then furrender themfelves to any other, in which they may ferve, and be entitled to His Majefty's most gracious Pardon.
