AT the Court at Kenfington, the 10th Day of August, 1759,

#### PRESENT,

The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THEREAS His Majefty was pleafed by His Order in Council of the 11th of July last, to declare and order, (amongst other Things) That all fuch of His faithful Subjects, who should from and after that Time inlift themfelves as Soldiers in His Land Service, should not be fent out of Great Britain, and should be intitled to their. Discharge in three Years, or at the End of the War, if they fhould chuse it; -His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth hereby most graciously repeat and confirm the fame, with relation to fuch as shall hereafter enlift on those Conditions; as also to such as have been inlisted in any Corps from the 11th of July laft to this Day-But whereas Doubts have arifen with Refrect to the Extent and Meaning of His Ma. jefty's faid Order,-His Majefty in Council doth therefore hereby declare, That the Conditions therein contained are not-meant or intended to extend to fuch who fhall inlift themfelves in Great Britain, to ferve in Regiments Abroad, whether Ireland or elsewhere, or to such who may chu'e to inlift in any of His Majefty's Corps in the usual Manner, without Limitation of Time or Place of Service.

The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Proclamation of the Fifteenth of May laft, " For giving Encouragement to " Seamen, and Able bodied Landmen, to enter " themfelves on Board His Majefty's Ships of "War; for granting Rewards for discovering

" fuch Seamen" as fhall conceal themfelves; for " pardoning fuch Seamen as have deferted, and " fhall return into the Service ; and alfo for " taking up all ftraggling Seamen", was, by Order in Council of the 26th of June laft, prolonged and extended from the 3d of July, to the 18th of this Inftant August - And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, that the fame should be continued for fome Time longer ; -His Majefty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, that the Time limited by the faid Order in Council, be prolonged and extended from the aforefaid 18th Day of this Inftant Auguft, to the 29th Day of September next, and that, the Bounties and Rewards given and granted by His Majefty's aforementioned Proclamation, be continued to be paid until the faid 29th Day of September next: - Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.

Hague, August 24. The Army under the Command of Prince Ferdinand entered the Counry of Waldeck on the 13th, and directed its march lo as to gain the Flank of the Enemy, who was then poffed in the Neighbourhood of Caffel, which however M. de Contades thought proper to abandon on the 18th, and feems to be retiring towards Marpourg. On the 19th, Major Fridricks, of the Hanoverian Chaffeurs, summoned that City, which furrendered, after fome Cannon Shot, with a Garrifon of 400 Men Prifo-ners of War, together with 1500 Wounded, which the Enemy had been obliged to leave behind them : A very confiderable Magazine likewife fell into our Hands there.

Luckner's Huffars, on the 15th, routed a confiderable Detachment of the Enemy at Volckmiffen.

On the 17th, the Hereditary Prince diflodged from Wolshagen a Part of M. d'Armentieres's Corps; and, on the fame Day, the Duke of Holftein took, Sword in Hand, a whole Batta-



lion of the Grenadiers Royaux at Naumbourg,

in Sight of the Enemy's Army. General Imhoff is in full March towards Munfter, in order to carry on the Siege of that Place.

Hague, August 24. Accounts have been received here from Berlin and Magdebourg, of the 18th Inftant, by which the Situation of the King of Pruffia, fince the Action of the 12th, appears by no Means fo bad as had at first been represented : The Russians had not then ventured to make any fresh Attempt, and his Prusfian Majefty was employed in taking all poffible Measures to maintain his Ground, and was get-ting together a fresh Supply of Artillery, in which great Part of his Lofs had confifted.

Madrid, August 13. On Friday the 10th Instant, a little after Four o'Clock in the Morning, his Catholick Majefty departed this Life at Villa Viciola.

Treasury Chambers, August 7, 1759. THEREAS notwithstanding the several Acts of Parliament now in Force for preventing illegal Lotteries, and the feveral Convictions of Offenders in purfuance thereof, Information has been lately given to the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majefty's Treasury, that there is now on Foot in Ireland a Scheme for raifing a Sum of Money by the Sale of Tickets or Chances to be determined by the Drawing of the prefent State Lottery, and that the faid Scheme is handed about this Town and other Parts of this Kingdom, and that Tickets or Chances agreeable thereunto are offered to Sale in Defiance and Contempt of the feveral Acts of Parliament for prohibiting the fame; Therefore, in order to put a Stop to fuch unlawful Proceedings, and to prevent the Ignorant and Unwary from being drawn in by fo illegal and pernicious a Practice ; This is to inform the Public, that the Lords Com-miffioners of His Majefty's Treasury have given Directions to their Sollicitor to pro-fecute with the utmost Rigour and Severity of the Law all fuch as shall be anyways concerned in publishing fuch Schemes, or buying or felling any fuch Tickets or Chances. And whereas Mr. John M'Carrick and Mr. Henry Lunn, late of the City of London, were on the 8th of March 1757, convicted of the like Offence, and have ever fince absconded in order to avoid the Penalties thereby incurred : Therefore the Lords Commiffioners of the Treasury are hereby pleased to offer a Reward of Fifty Pounds, to be paid to any Perfon or Perfons that shall apprehend either of them, on immediate Notice thereof being given to Philip Carteret Webb, Efq; their Solicitor.

That for a farther Encouragement to able Men to inlift as aforefaid at the Guildhall of this City, and to ferve their King and Country with Zeal, and due Submiffion to Military Difcipline, during the Con-tinuance of the prefent War, every Soldier fo inlifted, who shall not have deferted, and who, after the Expiration of his Service, shall produce to the Cham-berlain of this City a Testimonial of his good Behaviour, under the Hand of a Field Officer, shall, thereupon, be immediately admitted by the faid Chamberlain, without Fee or Reward, to the Privi-lege of Setting-up and Exercifing fuch Trade within the faid City and Liberties thereof, as he is apt and able for.
