Warfaw, May 7.

HE King of *Poland* is at prefent at Zlokzow, about eight Leagues from Leopol, where feveral Confultations have been held with the Senutors of the Kingdom, about the neceflary preparations to be made for the en-

abling his Majefty to take the Field again; who, it is faid, very much complains, that after a Campagne of 7 months, in which fo great advantages have been procured to the Crowns by reftoring under its obedience the greatelf part of the Ukraine, and in which both his Majefty in his own Person, and all his Soldiers have suffered fo much; through the fcarcity of Provisions they found in many places, and the Dangers and Fatigues of the Cam-pagne, so care has been taken here at home to furnish him with the supplies necessary, or to enable him to recruit his Army, which is become fo weak, that it cannot honger keep the Field ; wherefore, we are told, his Majefty has written to Rome, to pray the Pope, and the Colledge of Cardinals, to haften the monies they have defigned for the affiftance of the Poles in this War against the Common Enemy, against whom his Majesty has hitherto almost at his own proper cost been forced to maintain the War. His Majefty, as we understand, consinues his refenement against the General of Lithuaning for his withdrawing the Forces of that Dutchy from the Army, which his Majesty thinks he did at the persuasion of those that are not well-affected to his perfon, and with intention, that his Majefty might be oppreft by the Infidels in the Hhraine. The King feems likewife to think, that endeavors have been uled with the Moscovites, to keep them from joining their Forces with his, and with Dorofenske, to hinder the fubmission he intended to make to his Majefty, who, amongst these perplexities, remains refolved however to purfue the War.

Naples, May. 7. Two days fince, the Prince of Mon-refarchio received his Commiffion from Spain, to be General of the Naval Forces of that Crown ; and at the fame time (as we are told) arrived Bills of Exchange for 150 000 Rixdollars, to be employed for the Refitting the Span fb Men of War that are here, fo that we now hope in a fhort time to fee them in a posture to The 800 Germans who lately arrived here, partfail. ed hence the last Weck in feveral Veffels, hired for that purpole, for Sitily, and with them were funt great quantities of Ammunition, and all forts of Military Pro-Our Letters from Melazzo, tell us, That the visions. Rome, May II. The Pope, after feveral days of Indifposition, is now perfectly well again, as far as his great age will permit. On Wednesday last, Cardinal Nithard; Ambassader of Spain, had a long Audience of his Holiness, on the Subject of the Mediation offered by this Court, for the putting an end to the present War. It is expected that there will be fuddenly a new promotion

of Cardinals, which the Cardinal *Altieri* very much endeavors. No Expedients can as yet be found out for the reconciling the differences between the Cardinal Patrons and the Ambassadors, though great endeavors have to that end been used.

Madrid, May 12. From Gadiz of the 21 paft, they write, That the Datch Men of War, who had Convoyed a Fleet of Merchantmen homeward bound, as far as Lifbon, were returned, without having met with any French Men of War, notwithftanding it was reported that a Squadron was Cruifing off of Cape St. V. ncent, under the Command of Monfieur de Chafteauneuf, fo that it is though the is either gone back for Bre/t, or paffed up the Mediterranean towards Sičily. The Men of Waf that are fitting at Cadiz, will be ready very fuddenly j and we are told, that feveral Men of War are fitting out in Holland at the charge of this Crown, to be employed in thefe Seas:

Hamburgh, May 24. From Copenhagen they write, That that King had given out Committions for the raifing of three new Regiments, to ftrengthen the Army he has already on foot; that the Fleet will be ready to go to Sea before the end of this month, and that other preparations are there making for War. The Suedes attempt as yet nothing farther against the Elector of Brandenburgh; it is reported here, that they will march towards the Elbe, and into the Bishoprick of Halberfladt, in order to their conjunction with the Troops of the Duke of Hansuer, which are reckoned at \$000 Men.

strasburgh, Muj 24. The Count de Montecucult having as we told you in our last, acvanced with his Troops to Wilftadt. about a League and an half from hence, Monficur de Turenne came with part of his Army the 21 initant 10 Gravenstaden on the River Ill, about a League from this City, to observe the motions of the Imperialists, who, it was thought, would have passed the Rhine here. The 22 infant, the Count of Mentecuculi came over the Rhiney and vifited the Fortifications of this City, and took an account of its feituation, but would not come into the Town, though defired by our Magistrates ; this day the faid Count is marched with all the Forces he has at prefent with him, taking his way ton wards Philipsburg, and will this night have his quarters at Bischofheim; hereupon Monfieur de Turenne is likewife marched that way on the other fide of the Rhine towards Benfelde.

Francfort, May 26. The three Regiments of Gallas; Harrant, and Trantmandorfe, are arrived from Bon in this Neighborhood, and to morrow they will pafs the Main here, to join the other Imperialifts. The Imperial Army hath paffed the Neckar, and marches towards the Rhine; The Prince Pio, who has, it feems the Van, arrived yefterday at Swetzingen on the Rhine, over againft Spire, with 4000 Men, after having been the day before with the Elector Palatine at Fredericksbourg, who yefterday in the evening repaired likewife thither, having caufed 2000 Foot to join the faid Prince. General Montecuculi is likewife on his march from Strasburg towards Philipsburg, which, it is generally believed, will be befieged. Two flying Bridges have been brought to
