By the KING, A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE R HEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to Thursday the Fourth Day of October next; We, with the Advice of Our Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare, That the said Parliament shall be further prorogued, on the faid Fourth Day of October, to Tuesday the Thirteenth Day of November next; and We have given Order to Our Keeper of Our Great Seal of Great Britain, to prepare a Commission for proroguing the same accordingly. And We do hereby further declare Our Royal Will and Pleasure, That the said Parliament shall, on the faid Thirteenth Day of November next, be held and fit for the Dispatch of divers weighty and important Affairs: And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons, are hereby required to give their Attendance accordingly at Westminster on the said Thirteenth Day of November next.

The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Proclamation of the Fisteenth of May last, "For giving Encouragement to " Seamen, and Able bodied Landmen, to enter " themselves on Board His Majesty's Ships of " War; for granting Rewards for discovering " fuch Seamen as shall conceal themselves; for " pardoning fuch Seamen as have deferted, and " shall return into the Service; and also for " taking up all flraggling Seamen", hath been prolonged and extended to the 20th of this Instant September: And whereas it is judged expension for His Majesty's Service, that the same should be continued for some Time longer; His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, that the faid Time be prolonged and extended from the aforesaid 29th Day of this Instant September, to the 9th Day of November next; and that the Bounties and Rewards given and granted by His Majesty's asorementioned Preciamation, be continued to be paid until the faid 9th Day of November next: -Whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice, and givern themselves accordingly.

The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council of the 11th of July last, to declare and order, (amongst other Things) That all such of His faithful Subjects, who should from and after that Time inlift themselves as Soldiers in His Land Service, should not be sent out of Great Britain, and should be intitled to their Discharge in three Years, or at the End of the War, if they should chuse it; -His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth hereby most graciously repeat and confirm the same, with relation to fuch as shall hereaster enlist on those Conditions; as also to such as have been inlisted in any Corps from the 11th of July last to this Day—But whereas Doubts have arisen with Respect to the Extent and Meaning of His Majesty's said Order, - His Majesty in Council doth therefore hereby declare, That the Conditions therein contained are not meant or intended to extend to fuch who shall inlist themselves in Great Britain, to serve in Regiments Abroad, whether Ireland or elsewhere, or to such who may chuse to inlist in any of His Majesty's Corps in the usual Manner, without Limitation of Time or Place of Service.

Hague, Sept. 25. According to the last Accounts received from Prince Ferdinand's Army, his Serene Highness marched the 19th to Corisdorff, where his Head Quarters remained on the 21st Instant. The Grand Army was encamped about two Miles from Giessen, which was in their Front, with their Right at Rotheim and the Left to Weismar. General Wangenheim and the Prince of Bevern were advanced along the Lahne opposite to Wetzlar. The French Camp was on the other Side of that River in different Corps, extending from the Right of Giessen to Wetzlar, of which they were in

Prince Henry's Army was at Lauban and Weislenberg: The Russians were at Guben: And Marshal Daun was at Bautzen; and had pushed a Corps to Spremberg; but, nothing of Importance had then passed between the respective Armies.
