From Thursday May 27. to Wonday May 31. 1675.

HE last Week arrived here from Geneva the Sieur Gaumont, Envoy Extraordinary from the Most Christian Kingsto the Princes of Italy, and is fince gone fo Florence. By a velicity of the Basila of Tripoli; and by other Vestes arrived from Sicily we receive an account of the great preparations that the Spaniards are making to attack Messina by Land having to that end formed a Camp not far from the City, and taken the most advantageous Posts about it. The contrary winds have very much retarded the French Gallies and Men of War, that are with a great number of other Vessels laden with Soldiers and Provisions on their way to Messina, though we must now expect to hear very suddenly of their arrival at Messina, which wil certainly be most welcome to those Inhabitants.

Copenhagen, May 18. They work here with all the diligence possible, for the sitting out the Men of War intended for the Sea this Summer; and it is not doubted, but they will be very suddenly ready to fail, if not hindered through the want of Seamen, which all endeavors are used to procure. We are informed that several new Regiments of Horse are to be raised, and though the Bueder Ambassador be still here, and hath daily Conferences with the Ministers of this Court, about confirming the Peace between the two Crowns, yet matters look as if War was more thought on than Peace. Upon the news of the Suedes being on their march towards the Elbe, to join, as is faid, with the Troops of the Duke of Manouer, his Majesty has sent orders to severat Regi-ments of Horse and Footto march, and to go and join with those Forces that are quartered in the Borders of Holftein, for the better fecurity of things on that fide; by which it appears, that there is no great confidence between the two Crowns.

Strasburg, May 27. On Friday last, as hath been faid, General Monse usuli parted from our Neighborhood, having left the Regiment of Reys, and part of the Regiment of Spork near Keil, to which our Magistrates have joined 100 Men for the guard of our Bridge on that side of the Rhine, while the Suiffers are in the Fort which secure it on this side. Yesterday morning the Troops of the Circles which were quartered at Keil parted from thence, and towards evening the Marquis of Baden Dourlach their General left this place, in order to the putting himself at the Head of the Troops of the Circles which are now on their march towards the Rhine, to affilt at the Siege of Philipsburg in order whereunto, Prince Pio is already passed the Rhine with 5000 Men, and hath invested the place. On Sunday last General Montesuculi was quartered at Rastat, from whence he intended to go and join the Imperial Army that comes down from Hailbron, under the Command of General Spork, and the Prince of Lorrain; which done, he will with his whole Army pass the Rhine, over Bridge which is now preparing for that purpose between Spire and Philipsburg; it is faid here, that General Montecuculi will be firong enough in cafe Monfieur de Turenne, intend to relieve Philipsburg, to fight him, and continue the Siege at the same time, Monfieur de Turenne marches this day from Benfeld towards Dahftein, from whence it is believed he will continue to march towards Philipsburg; to hinder the design of the Imperialist, so that we may suddenly expect to hear of some Action between them.

Gluckstadt, May 30. The King of Denmark has appointed a Rendezvous of his Forces at Flensburg, whither accordingly will repair the Kings own Regiment, consisting in 1200 Men, the Queens Regiment in 1200, the Sieur Fan Ostens Regiment in 2500, Major General chaceks Regiment in 2500, Arendorst Regiment in 2500, Citnaus Regiment in 2000, Wilmans Regiment in 2000; the Generals Regiment in 1200, Wejers Regiment 1200 Bremers Regiment 1200, Rosenkrans Regiment 1200, Liekens Regiment 1200, Degenseldss Regiment 1200, Storbackers Regiment 1000, Colonel Veices Bataillon 500, in all 22700 Men, besides the Troops his Majesty has in the County of Detmenhorst, and in Norway, which are said to be likewise sent for.

Frantfort, May 30. The Confederates feem in good earnest to intend the Siege of Philipsburg's the 25, and the 26 instant, Prince Pio, who, we told you in our last, was Commanded out with 3000 Men from the Imperial Army, under the Command of General sporke. and the Prince of Lorrains and had joined 2000 Men of the Circle of Franconia, passed the Rhine, by the means of Pontons, and have posted themselves above and below Philipsburg about half a Mile from the The 27, the Elector Palatine arrived at Spire, and hath-lodged 1000 Men in the Suburbs of that City, and at present they are making a Bridge over the Rhine between spire and Philipsburg over against Lofheim, for the whole Imperial Army to pass, which had yesterday its Head quarter at Langenburg, General Montecucult having the day before joined it there with the Forces he brought from Strasburgh. The Lunenburg Troops will have this day their quarters in the Neighborhood of Fridburg an Imperial City about fix Miles from hence. the Duke of Lunenburg arrived with them the 27, being come Post, upon an account of some disorders that hap ned among them, which his presence appealed. Regiments of Gallas, Harrant and Trautmandorf have this day passed the Main here, to go and join the Imperi-The Bishop of Wurrsburg, who is likewise Duke of Franconia, being lately dead, the Bishop of Bamberg hath been elected by the Chapter to succeed him. The Elector of Mayence is very ill. The Impoperialists are endeavouring to turn a small River which conveys fresh Water out of the Rhineinto Philipsburg.

Cologre, May 31. We have not yet any advice of the lorrain Troops having passed the Rhine, though it is said, that they will be this evening in our Neighborhood, and that the Duke of Lorrain will be here in person, The Sieur Fario, who hastistiad for several Months passed his quarters in this Diotes, is now prevaring to leave them. The Letters from Westphalia tell us, That the 27 instant, the Elector of Brandenburgh parted from Paderborne, after having conserved with the Bishop of that name, for Cassel, in order to his joining his Army, which is on its march. Our Advices from above say, that Philipsburg is invested by the Imperial sets.
