From Monday May 31. to Churghay June 3. 1675.

HE Troops railed in Germany for the Service of the Crown of Spain in Sicily, arrive here daily, and as fast as the weather will permit, they are Embarked for that Kingdom. Some that arrived the last Week, brought with them in Chains between 30 and 40 Protestant Ministers or Preachers of Hungary and those other parts, who were immediately put into the Galleys, to remain there as long as they live, which is hard measure; and they are much to be piried, being most of them Persons well bern. We have advice, That 13 or 14 Barks, laden with Provisions, are entered into Messing.

Legorn, May 20. Yesterday passed by this place the French Gallies, Men of War and Victuallers, designed for Messina, making in all above 100 Sail, we are assured that a Bord this Fleet, are 5000 Foot Soldiers, and 400 Horsemen, with a vast quantity of Provisions.

Ratisbon, May 30. It hath been debated in the Dyet, that fresh and peremptory Orders should be sent abroad, prohibiting any Levies to be made within the Empire for Foreign Service. On Tuesday last, the Sieur Marechal, the Suedift Minister, parted from hence with his whole Family, though we are told another is to come in his place, which is much doubted. The Troops of the Elector of Bavaria continue in their quarters; so that it is plain his Electoral Highness ha not any shough sof engaging in the present War, but onely to keep fuch a Force on foot as may enable him to maintain a Meutrality. The Election which the Chapter of wirtzburg hath made of the Bishop of Bamberg to be Bishop of that Diocess, is much to the satisfaction of the Imperislifes, the faid Bishop of Bamberg, having been recommended by the Emperor, and being a person of great Abilities, and wholly addicted to the Interests of the House of Austria.

Hamburg, June 4. From Stein of the first instant they write, That the 28 pasts a party of 150 Suedish Horse had surprized 200 Branden burg Horse; Commanded by Lieutenant-Collonel Trappane, in a small Town called Coningsberg, about three Leagues from Stein, that 25 of the B andenburgs had been killed upon the place, and most of the rest taken Prisoners. The 30 pasts, General Wrangel parted thence to his Army, which marches towards the Elbe to join with the Forces of the Duke of Hanner. On the other side we kear, That the Brandenburg Troops, which have had their Winter-quarters in Franconia come done with great marches. Our Magistrates upon the likelihood there seems to be of a War in these parts have sent Deputies to the Emperor, to pray, they may be permitted to maintain a Neutralize

Strisburg May 31. Monsieur de Turenne having affembled his Forces together at Schlestadt and St. Hippolite, came and encamped with them the 27th instant, at Alenheim, so near this City, that from our Ramparts we can discern their Tents, &c. The 28, upon the news of the Siege of Philipsburg, Monsieur de Turenne advanced with several Regiments of Horse to Haguenam,

leaving the gross of his Army at Akenheim, whicher he returned again the next day. This day we are tolds he intends to make a general review of his Army, and that in the mean time he has ordered a Bridge to be made over the Rhine between Philipsburg and Brifac, as if he intended to pass the River, and give the Conf. derates a diversion on the other side, while General approaches with his Army on this side. The Marguis of Baden Dourlach at the same time is endeavouring to get the Troops of the Circles together, in order to the opposing his passage, and even the sinishing the Bridge they have now in hand.

Spire, June r. The 26 past Prince Pio passed the Rhine at Losheim, not far from this City, by means of two flying Bridges, which had been brought from Manheim, and encamped on this fide with 6000 Men, whom he immediately fet to work, for the making a retrenchment, for their better security against the Enemy, which they had finished the next day at noon; the 29, the Bridge of Boats was finished, and the next day General Montecuenti arrived at Losheim with the Imperial Army confisting in about 25000 Combatants, the same day his Excellency paffed the Khine, and having vifited Prince Pio's Camp, returned again to Losbeim, where a Council of War was held yesterday; this day the Imp. this fide : General Montecucult, and several of the General Officers being ar prefent here with the Elector Palatine: the parries that have been sent out to learn the posture of the Enemy, are returned, and bring an account that Monsieur de Turenne was three days fince at Haguenam with 6000 Horfe, but that he is returned towards Strasburg. We cannot certainly learn the defigns of the Imperialists, but in all appearance they will march directly towards the Enemy, in confidence that they exceed them in strength, leaving some Regiments in the Neighborhood of Philipsburg, to keep that place blocked up, in order to a future Siege, in cafe it shall be thought fit, or at least for the preventing the excurfions of that Garison into the Palatinate, &c.

Francfort, June z. The three Imperial Regiments of Gallas, Harrant, and Trautmandorf have passed the Main here, and are marching with all diligence to join the Imperial Army. The Lunenburg Troops are in our Neighborhood; it is reported, that they will join with the General Montecuciuli, for the execution of some great design in hand, though the general Voice is, that they will march towards Cologne to join with the Duke of Lorrain. The Elector of Mayence continues very ill, and leaves us almost in despair of his recovery.

Cologne, June 4. The 31 past, the Troops of the Duke of Lorrain passed the Rhine at Bonne, and are at present lodged about three Leagues from hence, their Head-quarter being at Endouen: the next day his Highness came hither, was Complimented by our Elector, and presented with a fine Horse, and cowards evening his Highness returned again to Endouen. The Troops of the Bishop of Osnabrug making 5000 Men are on their march towards Bon to pass the Rhine there and to join with those of the Duke of Lorrain. The Bishop of Munster
