PRESENT,

The King's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Proclamation of the 15th of May laft, "For " giving Encouragement to Seamen and able bodied " Landmen to enter themfelves on board His Ma-" jefty's Ships of War; for granting Rewards for « discovering such Seamen as shall conceal them. " felves ; for pardoning fuch Seamen as have defert-" ed and shall return into the Service ; and also for " taking up all ftragling Seamen," hath been prolonged and extended to the 31ft of this Inftant December; — And whereas it is jadged expedient for His Majefty's Service, that the fame should be continued for fome Time longer-His Majefty doth. therefore, by and with the Advice of His privy Council, hereby Order that the faid Time be prolonged and extended from the aforefaid 31ft Day of this Instant December, to the 11th Day of February next; and that the Bounties and Rewards given and granted by His Majefty's aforementioned Proclamation, be continued to be paid until the faid 11th Day of February next-Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.

Rome, Dec. 15. The Pope's Frigates having been fitted out at Civita Vecchia, put to Sea a few Days ago, to cruize on the Barbary Pi-rates. They are to call at Marseilles to take in Stores, &c. to rebuild the Frigate St. Peter. The Princes Chigi and Ruspoli are preparing to fet out for Vienna, to receive the Order of the Golden Fleece, lately conferred on them by the Emperor.

Florence, Dec. 22. On the 12th Instant, M. Borromei, the late Pope's Nuncio in this City, fet out for Rome. He will proceed afterwards to Vienna, at which Court he is to refide in the fame Quality. One of the Emperor's Men of War, named the Alerione, commanded by Commodore Acton, failed a few Days ago

from Leghorne, to cruize against the Prussian Privateers. Another of the Emperor's Ships, the Eagle, having fuffered greatly in a Storm, has, with the utmost Difficulty, got into Siracufa. She has received great Damage, and is fo much decayed, that 'tis thought fhe will never be able to put to Sea again.
