

Naples, May 21. HE Prince of Montefarchio, General of the Spanifh Armada, omits no diligence for the haftening the Men of War to Sea, and we are affured that they will be ready in 10 or 12 dayes. In the mean time, the Masquis of Wills Franca, Viceroy of Sicily, prepares things for a formal belieging Mellina by Land, having already cauled - his Troops to take fuch advantageous Posts about the place, and fo well fortified themfelves in them , that a good ftep feems to be made towards the faid fiege ; the French at the fame time are not wanting on their part, being at prefent about raifing a new Cittadel, and a new Fort, at the mouth of the Fare, and making other Fortifications for the better frength of the place. We are told that the Meffineses have chosen the Chevalier de Villavoir to be their Stratico, an Officer of grear power and authority among them.

Venice, June 1. From Rome we have advice, That the Pope had made a promotion of fix new Cardinale, though with little fatisfaction to the Crowns. The -French Secretary here hath again complained to the Senate, of the liberty that hath been granted the Spanish Ambaffador, to embark feveral thousand Men at Triefte, to be Transported to Sicily, in order to their fervise against the French in Meffina, and defires, that at the least the like may not be allowed for the future; on which Subject the Senate returned not any answer to the thid Secretary, but have written a Letter to his Mon Chriftian Majefly, to justifie their proceedings. We have advice by the way of Boffuna, That Abraham Baffa, who is appointed to command the Ottoman Forces this Summer, was come with his Army to the Danube, over which he was making a Bridge for the passage of his Forces.

Vienna, June 2. Their Imperial Majeffies will return hither from Laxemburgh the fixth inflant, that the Emprefs, who grows near her time, may Lie in here. The Emperor hath fent final orders to General Cops, who commands his Forces in Silefia, to join them with those of the Elector of Brandenburgh, and to act jointly against the Succes, who, we have advice, continue to commit Hostilities upon the Subjects of his Electorat Highness. On Sunday lass parted hence an Express to the Imperial Minister at the Port, with influctions to him, to complain of several violences lately committed by the Turks on the Frontiers, and to demand statisfaction;

Rathbow, Fune 6. Yefterday in the evening paffed through this place an extraordinary Courier, being difpatched to Vienna, to give the Emperor an account of the death of the Elector of Majence. The Troops of the Blector of Bavaria continue fill in their quarters, fo that there is not hitherto any appearance of his Eleforal Highnelles employing them this Summer. Majence, Fune 7. the Elector of Brandenburgh was returned to Sweinfut in Frankonia, where his Army had had its Head-quarter this Winter, That he had already canfed part of his Forces to march towards Maegdeburgiand was refolved to follow with the reft in few days. The Troops of the Duke of Lunenburgh are on their march towards Bon.

Sirasburg, June 7. This morning, very carly, Monsieur de Turenne decamped from his quarters at Akenheim and Schofheim, with defign, as is believed, to pafs the Rhine, on the Bridge of Boats he has caused to be laid over the River near Rheinam, which is now guarded on the other fide by the Marquis de Vaubrun, with four or 5000 Men, who passed the Rhine at Brifar. It is faid that Monfieur de Turenne intends to post himself at Wilftadt, on the other fide of the Rhine, about two Leagues from this place, and fo put himfelf between us and the Imperialifis, though others are of opinion he will attack Offenbourg, about four Leagues from hence, where are at prefent 3000 Men of the Troops of the Circles, with their General the Marquis of Baden Dourlach. General Montecuculi, according to our laft advices, having left Major General Dunemaldt with eight Squadrons of Horfe for the guard of the Bridge near Spire, was encamped ar Langenbruck, being refolved to murch with all the diligence poffible towards thefe The Elector Palatine remains still at Spire, haparts. ving lodged his Troops in a finall place called Marientraut, to hinder the Incursions of the Garifon of Philipsburgh.

Cologne, Fune 11. The ninth inflant, the Sieter Fifcher, the Imperial Minister, returned hither from Coefveldt, where he had been, to confer with the Bishop of Munfter, on the Subject of the late Treaty concluded by his Envoy at Vienna, which the Bishop promises he will now ratifie, and accordingly caufe his Forces, which are to confift in 9000 Men, to march, purfuant to fuch orders they shall receive from the Emperor, or his General. The Troops of the Duke of Lunenburg are arrived within fix Leagues of Bon ; the ninth arrived here à Gentleman dispatched to our Magistrates, by the Duke of Zell, to defire liberty to buy up a quantity of Corn for the ule of his Army, which was granted. The Forces of the Bilhop of Ofnabrug are likewife on their march, and it is thought, that by the 15 inflant, may be the Conjun-Aion of these confederates, the Duke of Lorrain conrinning in the Neighborhood of Bon, for that purpole. The Governor of Bon having, it feems, fome apprehenfion, that the Enemy may this Summer make fome attempt upon that place, cauled the Magistrates of the City to affemble the fixth instant, whom he defired, that the necessary provision of Corn might be made by the feveral Inhabitants, and care taken in all things that depend upon them, for the fecurity of the place, in cafe of the worft.

Bon, June 11. We now expect in few days to fee the Conjunction of the Troops of Lunenburg; Ofnabrug, and Lorrain, in our Neighborhood; the Lunenburgs are reckoned at 8000 Men, those of Ofnabrug at 5000, and the Troops of the Duke of Lorrain, who are at prefert quartered in the Villages hereabouts, 3000, fo that
