HIS Day, the Lords being met, <sup>2</sup> Meffage was fent to the Honourable Houfe of Commons by Mr. Quarme, DeputyGentleman Uther of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that The Lords, autnorized by Virtue of His Majefly's Commiffion, for declaring His Royal Affent to one Act agreed upon by both Houfes, do defire the immediate Attendance of this Honourable Houfe in the Houfof Peers, to hear the Commiffion read; and the Commons being come thither, the faid Commiffion, impowering his Royal Highnefs the Prince of Wales, his Royal Highnefs the Duke of Cumberland, the Lord Archbifhop of Canterbury, the Lord Keeper of the Great Seal, the Lord Prefident of the Council, and feveral other Lords, to declare and notify the Royal Affent to the faid Bill was read accordingly, and the Royal Affent given to,

An Act for granting to his Majefly feveral Duties upon Malt; and for raifing the Sum of Eight Millions, by Way of Annuities, and a Lottery, to be charged on the faid Duties; and to prevent the fraudulent obtaining of Allowances in the gauging of Corn making into Malt; and for making forth Duplicates of Exchequer Bills, Tickets, Certificates, Receipts, Annuity Orders, and other Orders, loft, burnt, or otherwife deftroyed.

W HE R E A S John Room, alias Rome, commonly called the Elder, of Tordiff, in North Britain, Farmer, and James Room, alias Rome, of the faid Place, Farmer, Brother of George Room, alias Rome, of the faid Place, and often called Little Jemmy, or Fighting Jemmy; were, upon the Nineteenth Day of January laft, charged by Information of two credible Perfons upon Oath, by them fubscribed, before Mountague Farrer, Elq; one of His Majefty's Juftices of the Peace for the County of Cumberland, with having been guilty, upon the Sixth Day of December laft, of being, together with divers other Perfons, to the Number of Eleven and upwards,

armed with Fire Arms and other offenfive Weapons, and fo armed being affembled on Horfeback at a Place called Brough Marsh in the County of Cumberland, in order to be aiding and affiiting in conveying and carrying away uncuftomed Goods, and forcibly hindering, obstructing, opposing and refist-ing the Officers of the Customs in the due Execution of their Duty, and firing their Piftols at them — Which Information was afterwards certified by the faid Mountague Farrer, under his Hand and Seal, to one of His Majefty's Principal Secretaries of State, who hath laid the fame before His Majesty in His Privy Council, purfuant to the late Aft of Parliament of the Nineteenth Year of the Reign of His Privy Council, by this His Order in His Privy Council, require and command, that the feid John Room, alias Rome, commonly called the Elder, and James Room, alias Rome, Brother of George Room, alias Rome, and often called Little Jemmy, or Fighting Jemmy, and each of them, do furrender himfelf and themfelves, within the Space of Forty Days after the first Publication of this Order in the London Gazette, to the Lord Chief Justice, or one other of His Majefty's Justices of the Court of King's Bench, or to one of His Majesty's Justices of the Peace.
