P R E S E N T,

The King's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Proclamation of the 15th of May last, "For giving Encouragement to Seamen and able bodied Landmen to enter themselves on board His Majesty's Ships of War; for granting Rewards for discovering such Seamen as shall conceal themselves; for pardoning such Seamen as have deserted and shall return into the Service; and also for taking up all stragling Seamen," hath been prolonged and extended to the 11th of this Instant February; — And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, that the same should be continued for some Time longer—His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His privy Council, hereby Order, that the said Time be prolonged and extended from the aforesaid 11th Day of this Instant February, to the 24th Day of March next; and that the Bounties and Rewards given and granted by His Majesty's aforementioned Proclamation, be continued to be paid until the said 24th Day of March next. — Whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themselves accordingly.

Orders for the Court's going into Mourning on Sunday next, the 17th Instant, for the late Landgrave of Hesse-Cassel, viz.

- The Ladies to wear black Silk, plain Muslin, or Long Lawn Linnen, Crape Hoods, Shamoy Gloves, and black Fans.
- Undrefs; Black or grey Silk.
- The Men to wear Black, without Buttons at the Sleeves or Pockets, plain Muslin Cravats, Weepers, black Swords and Buckles.

Whereas by an Act of the General Assembly of the Province of Georgia in America, passed the 15th Day of March 1758, and approved and confirmed by His Majesty in Council, the 10th Day of August 1759, It is enacted, " That all and every Person and Persons, that now hold or claim to hold any Lot or Lots, Tract or Tracts of Land in the said Province, by Virtue of any Warrant of Survey, Allotment, nominal Title, or Possession, derived from or under the late Trustees, their President and Assistants, or any others acting by or under their Authority (such as hold under regular Grants passed under the common Seal of the said Trustees excepted) do and shall, within Three Years from
