The following is a Translation of the Declaration, delivered on the 3d Instant, by the Austrian activered on the 3d Instant, by the Austrian Minister residing at the Hague, to his Serene Highness Prince Lewis of Brunswick, in Anstwer to that which his Highness had delivered on the Part of His Majesty and the King of Prussia on the 25th of November last, to the Ministers of the Belligerant Powers. A like Declaration was also delivered, separately, at the same Time, by the respective Ministers of the Courts of Russia and France. and France.

HEIR Britannick and Proffian Majefties having thought proper to make known, by the Declaration delivered, on their Part, at the Hague the 25th of November last past, to the Ambassadors and Ministers of the Courts of Vienna, Petersbourg,

and Verfailles, refiding there; "That being fincerely defirous of contributing to "the Re-eftablifhment of the Publick Tranquility, " they were ready to fend Plenipotentiaries to the " Place, that shall be judged the most convenient, in order to treat there, of this important Object, " with those, which the Belligerant Parties shall " think proper to authorize on their Side, for at-taining fo falutary an End."

Her Majefty the Empress-Queen of Hungary and Bohemia; her Majefty the Empress of all the Ruffia's; and his Majefty the most Christian King; Ruma's, and his Majerly the most Constituting to equally animated by the Defire of contributing to the Re-eftablifhment of the Publick Tranquility, on a folid and equitable Footing, declare in Return; That His Majefty the Catholick King, having been pleafed, to offer his Mediation in the War, which has fublifted for fome Years, between France and En-

gland ; and this War having befides, nothing in common with that which the two Empresses with their Allies have likewise carried on for some Years against the King of Pruilia;

His most Christian Majesty is ready to treat of his particular Peace with England, through the good Offices of his Catholick Majesty, whole Mediation He has a pleafure in accepting.

He has a pleature in accepting. As to the War, which regards directly His Pruf-fian Majefty; their Majefties, the Emprefs-Queen of Hungary and Bohemia; the Emprefs of all the Ruffias; and the moft Chriftian King, are dif pofed to agree to the appointing the Congrefs propoled. But, as by Virtue of their Treaties, they cannot enter into any Engagement relating to Peace, but in Conjunction with their Allies, it will be ne-caffary in order that they may be enabled to exceffary, in order that they may be enabled to ex-plain themfelves definitively upon that Subject, that their Britannick and Pruffian Majesties should pre-viously be pleased to cause their Invitation to a Congrefs, to be made to all the Powers, that are directly engaged in War against the King of Prussia ; and namely, to his Majesty the King of Poland, Elector of Saxony, as likewife to his Majesty the King of Sweden; who ought fpecifically to be invited to the future Congress.

Hague April 11.
