The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council of the 23d of October last, for prohibiting the Exporting out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coastwise, Gunpowder, Salt Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire upon the 29th Day of this Inftant April—And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some longer Time-His Majefty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby Order, Require, Prohibit and Command, That no Person or Persons whatsoever (except the Master General, Lieutenant General, or Principal Officers of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service) do, at any Time during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid 29th Day of this Instant April, prefume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwile, any Gunpowder, Salt Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or fhip or lade any Gunpowder, Salt Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on Board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the fame into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the fame Coast-wife, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majefly, or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and fuffering the refprective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act passed in the Twenty Ninth Year of His Majesty's Reign, entituled, " An Act to impower His Majefly to pro-" hibit the Exportation of Salt Petre, and to enforce " the Law for impowering His Majelly to prohibit " the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of .. Arms and Ammunition ; and also to impower His "Arms and Ammunition; and and to imposed this "Majefty to reftrain the carrying Coaffwife of Salt "Petre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammu-nition."—And the Lords Commiffioners of His Ma-jetty's Treafury, the Commiffioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master Gene-ral of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.
