PRESENT, The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council. WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Proclamation of the 15th of May laft, "For " giving Encouragement to Seamen and able bodied " Landmen to enter themfelves on board His Ma-" jefty's Ships of War; for granting Rewards for " difcovering fuch Seamen as shall conceal them. " felves ; for pardoning fuch Seamen as have defert-" ed and shall return into the Service ; and also for " taking up all stragling Seamen," hath been prolonged and extended to the 10th of this Inftant May; — And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, that the fame should be continued for some Time longer; - His Majesty doth-therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, that the faid Time be pro-longed and extended from the aforefaid 10th Day of this Inflant May, to the 21ft Day of June next; and that the Bounties and Rewards given and granted by His Majesty's aforementioned Proclamation, be continued to be paid until the faid 21st Day of June next. - Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themselves accordingly.

The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council. WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council of the 23d of October laft, for prohibiting the Exporting out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coaltwife, Gunpowder, Salt Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire upon the 29th Day of this Inftant April-And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition fhould be continued for fome longer Time-His Ma jefty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby Order, Require, Prohibit and Command, That no Perfon or Perfon's whatfoever (except the Mafter General, Lieutenant General, or Principal Officers of the Ordnance for His Majefty's Service; do, at any Time during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid 29th Day of this Instant April, prefume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwife, any Gunpowder, Salt Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship or lade any Gunpowder, Salt Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on Board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the fame Coaftwife, without Leave or Permiffion in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty, or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and fuffering the refprective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act paffed in the Twenty Ninth Year of His Majesty's Reign,

" hibit the Exportation of Salt Petre, and to enforce " the Law for impowering His Majelly to prohibit " the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of " Arms and Ammunition ; and also to impower His Majefty to reftrain the carrying Coaftwife of Salt " Petre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammu-nition."-And the Lords Commiffioners of His Majetty's Treafury, the Commissioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master General of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may refpectively appertain.

By Letters of the 20th past, from the Right Honourable Admiral Boscawen to Mr. Clevland, there is an Account of the following Ships and Veffels being taken or retaken by His Majefy's Ships under his Command.

Le Soliel of Bourdeaux, of 360 Tons, 12 Guns, and 45 Men, laden with Stores, Ammunition and Provision, and commanded by M. Du Chamben, ta-. ken by Lieut. Norwood, in His Majesty's Ship the Adventure. She had on. Board, 1 Captain, 3 Lieu-tenants, 3 Serjeants, 3 Corporals, and 60 Private Men, and failed from Bourdeaux the 10th of April.

The Adventure has likewife retaken the Cathe-rine Brig of Briftol, laden with Salt and Fruit.

The Orford has taken the Margaret Schooner Pri-The Oriora has taken the Wargaret Schooner 11-vateer of Rochelle, of 8 Guns and 58 Men. She had been out only 4 Days, and had taken nothing. And also Le Paix of Rochelle, a large Chaffe Maree, bound to St. Domingo, with Flour, Wine, &c. She has also retaken the Dolphin Snow of Briftol, laden with Port Wine and Fruit.

The Jano has taken fix Coafters with 300 Tons of Wine.

The Venus has taken the Hero of Bourdeaux, bound to St. Domingo, with Flour, Wine, and Provilions.

The Shrewsbury has taken two Veffels laden with And has retaken the Friendship, Burton, Wine. Mafter, bound to Gibraltar with Beer and Grocery.

The Pallas has drove on Shore, on the Black Rock at the Entrance of the Bay Douverne, a Ship fuppofed to be outward Bound, of 400 Tons. The Ship, Cargo, and Crew, are all loft.
